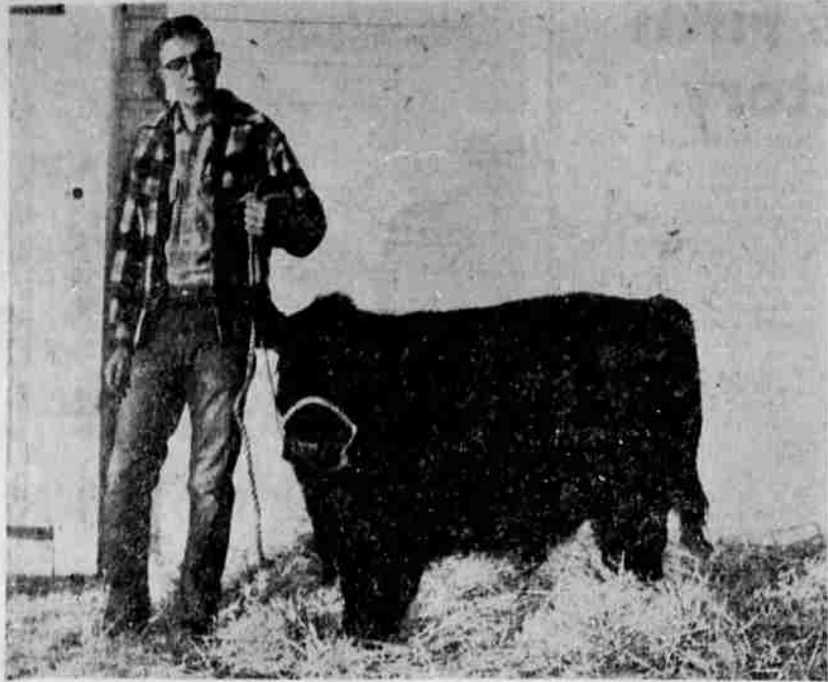

Safe Driving Day Set

December 15th, 1954 has been set aside by President Dwight D. Eisenhower as Safe Driving Day, and in this connection the local AAA office, 201 Main Street, has a limited supply of S-D Day bumper strips, to be distributed on a "first come first served" basis.

The American Automobile Association and its state organizations and local clubs continue to be increasingly active in cutting down automobile and pedestrian accidents, and making driving more enjoyable. They carry on a nationwide program of public education; campaign for uniform traffic regulations, signs, and signals; develop devices to train drivers and test their fitness to operate a car. They distribute safety literature and teaching aids to teachers; furnish the textbook "Sportsmanlike Driving," and provide driving instructions for high school students. Their pedestrian contest, in which Klamath Falls participates each year, has grown from a small beginning into one of the outstanding safety efforts in the nation, and is intended to encourage city and state officials to institute and carry out more effective programs to reduce pedestrian accidents.

Yakima Indians Accept Payment

TOPPENISH, Wash. (AP) — An offer by the Army Engineers of \$15,019,540 as compensation for loss of their fishing grounds at Celilo Falls on the Columbia River was accepted by a general council of the Yakima Indians here Friday night.

The huge settlement ended three years of controversy over the Celilo Falls fishery, which will be flooded out by the backwaters of The Dalles Dam.

Only 244 of the 900 or more Yakimas present cast ballots on whether to accept the Army Engineers' offer, 226 voting to accept and 18 voting to reject the settlement.

US Xmas Tree Custom Takes Hold South Of The Border

NOGALES, Mexico (AP) — Santa Claus is moving in south of the border, and the old folks don't like it. But the kids seem to.

Daily truckloads of Christmas trees—more than ever before, the U.S. Customs Service says—cross the international boundary line from Arizona into this bustling border town.

Older Mexicans shake their sombreros as they see these symbols of the "Gringo's" Christmas roll by.

They fear the kids, increasing fondness for Santa may wreck their own symbol of Christmas, the Nacimiento, a miniature portrayal of the straw-filled manger at Bethlehem.

Santa's influence is spreading into drab Mexican homes, where twinkling Yuletide lights gleam through more windows than ever.

Mexican children have sent letters to the Nogales Ariz. Herald listing their Christmas wishes for the pudgy resident of the North Pole to deliver Christmas eve.

More realistic Mexican children crowd around Spanish-speaking Santa Claus in the department stores.

The elder Mexicans concede Santa does a magnificent job when functioning in his own territory — on the American side of the border. "But each foot in his own shoe," they say.

The traditionalists hold that Santa is a strictly northern institution. If they could figure out a way to do it with typical Mexican politeness, they would gladly send him packing, jingle bells and all.

They see Santa flying in with his eight reindeer to break up their Christmas posadas — nightly processions starting Dec. 18 to commemorate the journey of Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem.

Montgomery Ward Hearing Slated

CHICAGO (AP) — A hearing in Louis E. Wolfson's suit against Chairman Sewell Avery and other directors of Montgomery Ward & Co. has been set for Jan. 10.

Wolfson, a Florida industrialist, has asked the court to declare Ward's method of electing directors illegal.

Wolfson has said he will seek to gain control of Ward's at the annual shareholder meeting April 22.

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Klamath County Aberdeen Angus Cattle Win Awards

Championship honors in Aberdeen Angus cattle entries on the western livestock show circuit were kept pretty well in the Klamath County West family this fall with Dale West, Merrill, and Elliott West, Bonanza, a nephew, sharing the ribbons.

The grand champion Angus steer of the Klamath Falls 4-H and FFA Rotary sponsored junior livestock show, went right on winning honors after he was sold on August 24 to the Dick B. Miller Company for \$2,000, a pound or \$227.

He climaxed his climb to further fame at the Capital Livestock Show and sale at Boise, November 20-23 when he was sold to the Western Hotel Corporation, after hitting the show circuit from the Cow Palace in San Francisco to Idaho.

The animal tagged Mr. 4 by 4, raised and shown by Elliott West, was judged to be one of the best animals ever shown in a local livestock show. He was too good to go over the block before more show goers had a chance to see the blocky steer and the decision to take him on the circuit followed.

The senior West, who has won championships locally, at the Pacific International Show at Portland and out of state, shipped the local champ with his show string, after it was sold back to Elliott by the Dick B. Miller Company at market price and it was shown under his name.

First stop was the Grand Livestock Show at the Cow Palace in San Francisco where he took second in the Angus junior yearling class. From there he went to the Intermountain Livestock Show at Ogden where he racked up the reserve Angus championship on November 16.

A few days later he was tagged interbreed grand champion of the Boise show. He weighed in at 1062 and sold for \$1 per pound. The Western Hotel Corporation operates both the Boise and the Owyhee in Boise.

The animal was sired by Ankney Bardell, bought several years ago in Chicago by Elliott's father, Gerald West and Earl Wilson, Malin, and since used as the West herd sire. The sire came from a purebred herd in Rhinebeck, Dutchess County, N.Y. His dam was of the Blackbird strain.

Elliott is feeding a half brother of the champion, a March calf from the same sire for showing next year. Elliott is a junior at Henry High School and plans to take veterinary training at Oregon State and to complete his work in veterinary medicine at the University of California.

Dale West's senior bull calf,

Bardolier BW2402, was named grand champion bull by two judges, William Volkman, Hacienda de Los Reges, California, and Harold Rankin, Hermiston, Oregon. Volkman, one of the best known California Aberdeen-Angus breeders has attended shows here.

West's Blackbird DW5 took the grand champion female ribbon in the two-year-old class. He took the reserve grand championship with the senior yearling bull Revolution of VF42nd. This get of Criterion Bardolier 24th stood on top for West in both get of sire classes.

Dale West, is the son and Elliott the grandson of the late L. A. West, known as the "granddaddy of the junior livestock show."

Sack Granted Execution Stay

PORTLAND (AP) — Circuit Judge Frank J. Lonergan Friday granted George F. Sack, convicted of first degree murder in the death of his wife, additional time to prepare an appeal.

Sack, a Portland apartment house owner, was scheduled to die in the gas chamber at the state penitentiary on Thursday. His attorney filed notice of appeal shortly after Sack was sentenced and this automatically stayed the execution.

Sack's attorney Friday was given until Dec. 21 to prepare his appeal to the State Supreme Court.

Oregon Seed Men Name President

PORTLAND (AP) — Very Scott of Sublimity is the new president of the Oregon Seed Growers League. Also elected Friday at the league's annual meeting here were: Hugh Willoughby, Harrisburg, vice president; and Ernest Jernstedt, Calton; Wallace Rice, Grants Pass; and Phil Ferrell, Madras, directors.

The league proposed revision of state seed laws so that persons substituting uncertified seed for certified seed would be penalized. The league also urged formation of commodity commissions to raise funds for various seed projects.

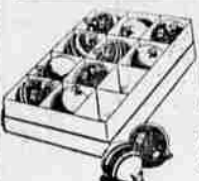

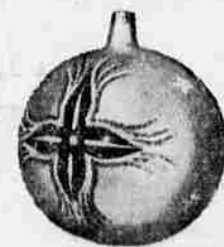
