Nation's Business Moves Into New Activity High

NEW YORK (AP)—Factories working overtime, department stores and auto showrooms jammed with holiday shoppers, construction booming along in spite of wintry cold...

Activity in many lines surged to new 1954 highs. The rush and bustle were in sharp contrast with the slow-turning wheels of a year ago when industry was slowing down and thousands were idle.

Auto output climbed to its highest point in 19 months; steel production at 81.5 per cent of capacity reached a new high for the year.

Industry leaders apparently were betting that business would be even better in 1955. Northwestern University said employers have indicated they will hire more college grads than in 1954 — and pay them more money.

Allowing for seasonal cutbacks in outdoor work, the overall employment picture was the brightest in months.

International Harvester Co. said it had hired 2,500 additional workers last month because of increased demand for farm machinery.

Controversial Tin Mining Firm Names New President

SEATTLE (AP)—Officials of the U.S. Tin Corp., target of a Senate committee's probe earlier this year, reported election of a new president Saturday and continuance of substantial government operations.

The firm has the only major tin mine in North America, about 90 miles north of Nome and across Bering Strait from Siberia.
