Mystery Man To Testify

LONDON (AP)—A mysterious American identified only as "Mr. X" will be asked to testify in the trial of a British clerk accused of spying for the Russians on Britain's anti-aircraft defenses and U.S. Navy headquarters here.

Former Wisconsin Governor Dies

MILWAUKEE (AP)—Fred R. Zimmerman, 74, former governor of Wisconsin and secretary of state since 1938, died early today in St. Luke's Hospital. He had been ill for more than two months.

Zimmerman, who in the last two state campaigns failed to win the endorsement of the regular Republican organization, led the Wisconsin state ticket in November in winning his eighth straight two-year term as secretary of state. He broke with the Republican organization after he had criticized Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.). He was governor in 1927-28.

ACCIDENT
MUNICH, Germany (AP)—Princess Beatrix von Thurn died in a Munich hospital Monday from injuries suffered Sunday in an automobile accident. She was 29.

Justice Sir Malcolm Hilbery, presiding at Old Bailey, London's criminal court, said the American is "discharging important duties" and gave the impression he might be a diplomat.

A request for the appearance of Mr. X was made yesterday by the accused man, John Clarence, 27. Clarence has pleaded innocent to charges of violating Britain's Official Secrets Act. His trial is set for Friday.

The defendant told the court the American "was handed about five sheets of paper." Prosecutor Christmas Humphreys said he was "sure" the mystery witness would agree to testify.

The justice then announced Mr. X would be invited to appear and would be in court if he was willing to attend. The word "willing" indicated the unnamed American could be a diplomat, immune from a court summons.

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Diplomats Speculate Over Latest Red China Protest

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP)—Diplomats speculated today that Peiping's renewed protests over United States detention of 35 Chinese students might be a hint that Red China wants to use them as a base for bargaining on the release of 11 American airmen it holds on spy charges.

Peiping radio said last night the United States would be flouting international law if it held the 35 in retaliation for the jailing of the airmen.

Linking of the two cases in the same broadcast led many U.N. delegates to wonder if Peiping was putting out feelers to see whether the United States would be willing to make some sort of a trade.

Some 4,500 Chinese students were in the United States when the Chinese Reds entered the Korean War. Of those who wanted to go home, 33 have since been released. But the State Department has not let the 35 leave the country because they had acquired skills in the United States that might be useful to the Communists.

U.N. Secretary General Dag Hammarskjöld was reported still hopeful the Chinese would accept his bid to go to Peiping to plead for the airmen.

U.N. officials said Hammarskjöld had derived encouragement from the fact that Peiping radio's two blasts against the airmen in the past two days had made no mention of his proposed visit or

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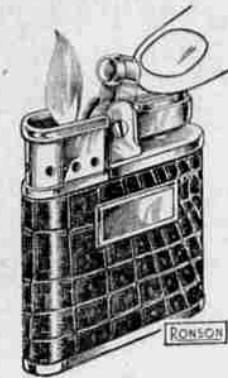
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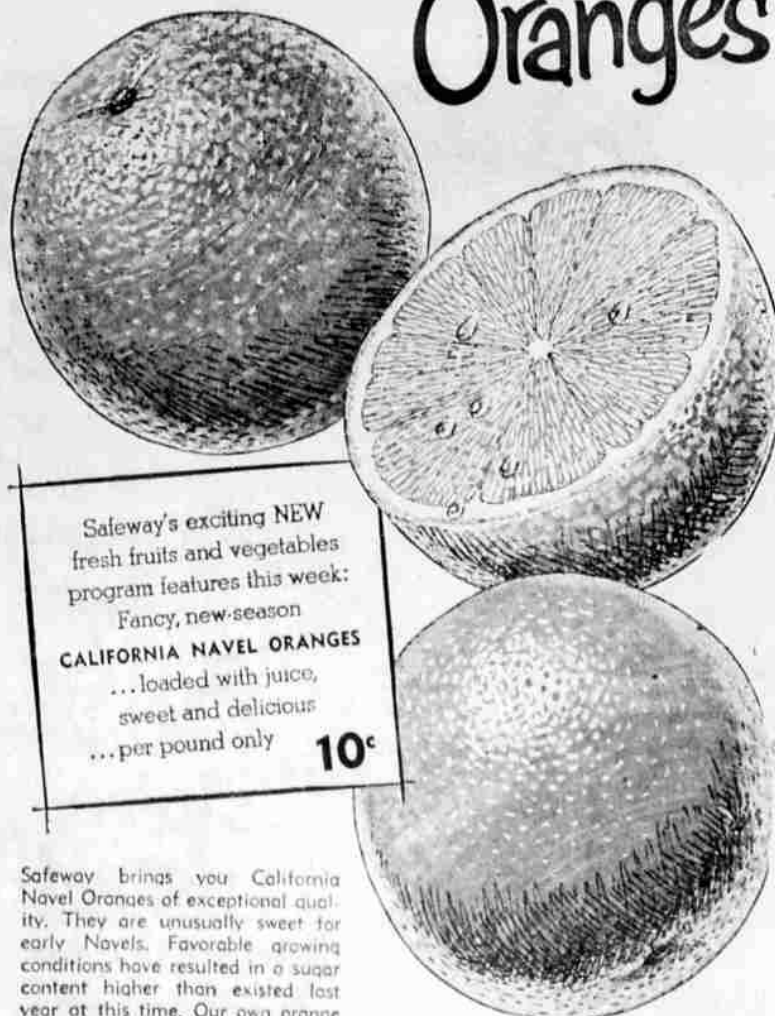
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
