Fair Building Bids Submitted

TULELAKE — Low bid on the main exhibit building for the Tulelake-Butte Valley fair grounds was submitted by Gibbons and Zick, Alturas, for \$33,500. Bids were opened December 13 in the office of the fair manager, William Whitaker with members of the board of directors present.

The punice tile and redwood building will have a concrete floor space of 70 by 160 square feet. Formal acceptance of the bid was postponed until December 14. Final approval must now be made by the Division of Fairs and Expositions, California State Department of Finance, Sacramento.

Other bids submitted included H. Y. Dorman, Westwood, California, \$43,650; B & R. Construction Company, San Francisco, \$42,950; Riverman & Sons, Portland, \$46,196 and the Butte Steel and Construction Company, Chico, for \$34,028.

Bids for administration and commercial buildings will be called for in January.
