CHRISTMAS COOKIES

Christmas is cookie-making time—for gift-giving, for tree-trimming and for family nibbling.

When you make Christmas cookies, naturally you want them to be the best for this most special of seasons. Best cookies are made with butter. Butter makes them so rich, tender and fresh-keeping.

Mrs. Santa's butter cookies are a perfect decorating cookie and they taste as good as they look. Candy Cane cookies will be favorites with the youngsters, while Scotch Shortbread will appeal more to adult tastes. You'll enjoy these additions to your own family favorites. MRS. SANTA'S COOKIES (Makes 6 dozen)

1 cup soft butter
1/2 cup sugar
1 egg, unbeaten
1 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
3 cups sifted flour
1/2 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon grated lemon rind
1/2 teaspoon lemon juice

Mix together butter, sugar, egg and vanilla thoroughly. Sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Add gradually to butter mixture, blending well. Add grated lemon rind and juice. Blend thoroughly. Wrap dough in waxed paper and chill 1 hour or longer. Roll on lightly floured board 1/2 inch thick. Cut with fancy cutters. Place on ungreased baking sheet and bake at 400 degrees for about 8 minutes. Cool and decorate.

CANDY CANE COOKIES (Makes 4 dozen)

1 cup butter
1 cup sifted powdered sugar
1 egg
1 1/2 teaspoon almond extract
1 teaspoon vanilla
2 1/2 cups sifted flour
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon red food coloring
1/2 cup crushed peppermint candy

1/2 cup sugar
Cream butter, powdered sugar, egg and flavoring. Sift together flour and salt and add. Divide dough in half. Blend food coloring into half of the dough. Roll 1 teaspoon of each color dough into two strips four inches long. Place strips side by side, pressing lightly together. Twist like rope. Place on ungreased cookie sheet, curling top down to form handle of cane. Bake at 375 degrees for 10 minutes, until lightly browned. Remove from cookie sheet and sprinkle with candy-sugar mixture.

SCOTCH SHORTBREAD (Makes 3 1/2 dozen)

2 cups butter
4 cups sifted flour
1 cup sugar
Cream butter, blend in sugar and flour. Work together until well mixed. Roll out 1/2 inch thick. Pat into ungreased shallow cake pans and cut into bars. Prick each cake all over with fork tines. Bake at 300 degrees for 20 to 25 minutes. The tops do not brown during baking. Keeps for weeks in a tightly covered tin box.
