

Oregon Tech Hoopsters Open Washington Series

Wally Palmberg and a 13 member traveling squad left yesterday for a four game tour into the state of Washington as his Oregon Tech Owls meet Olympic Junior College tonight and Saturday and then face St. Martin's Monday and Clark Junior College Tuesday.

The Mile High Campus quietest, which has already won its first pair of court battles, will be up against large odds when they face these northern neighbors, but the freshman-led hoop team could surprise several people on this jaunt.

Olympic is a member of the Washington JC Conference and has always produced good basketball clubs, while St. Martin's is a member of the very strong Evergreen League and meets clubs like Portland University and other big name independents. Clark is also a member of the WJCC.

Little is known of the three clubs the Owls will face this weekend except for the fact that Olympic is fresh from a victory over Linfield. The other two clubs have height and speed which could hurt the Owls.

Palmberg stated before he left on his trip, he would open against Olympic with Dennis Eckart and Don Hubble at the two forward posts, and Johnny James would take care of the pivot duties. At the guard positions will be Gary Dorn and Wayne Anderson.

Sure to see action over the four game trip will be freshmen Billy Cole, Gordon Fahlgren, Jerry Fasten, Ward Collingsworth, John McCutcheon, Alvin Taylor, Richard Perkins and Terry Blair.

Eckart, James and Fahlgren have been the big guns in the scoring column for the Owls so far this season and will undoubtedly carry the major share of point making into this series of tilts.

St. Martin's probably will be the largest team to face the Owls this weekend as they have one starter that stands 5-9, and the others stretched to 6-7. Led by Bob Forbis, the Rangers' center, who has averaged better than 16 points per game in the first five contests, St. Martin's is the big one for the OTI five.

The Owls will stay at Bremerton tonight and Saturday evening following the games, then move into Olympic Sunday for their Monday tilt with St. Martin's. On Tuesday night they will stay in Portland following their battle with Clark at Vancouver, and return home Wednesday, according to the Owl headman.

Bob Baker Favored Over Ring Opponent

NEW YORK (AP) — If Bob Baker, a 1-3 favorite, disposes of Coley Wallace tonight, the giant Pittsburgh Negro may find himself all dressed up with no place to go.

Ranked No. 4 among heavy-weight challengers, Baker has everything to lose and little to gain against Wallace. Big Bob gave Wallace a decisive whipping at Cleveland Oct. 1, dropping him once and alarming him around the ring in the late rounds. They meet again in a 10-rounder at Madison Square Garden.

Baker, like all heavyweights, has his eye on a shot at Rocky Marciano's title, but he'll have to take his place at the end of the line.

Don Cockrell, the British boxer, is a good bet to see the June match with Marciano, when and if Rocky decides to go back to work. Nino Valdes, the big Cuban who knocked out Hurricane Tommy Jackson, is No. 1 in most ratings. Cockrell and Valdes look like the next two opponents for Rocky with both fighting to be first.

That leaves Baker on the outside looking in, although he odds a decision over Valdes, scored at Huntington, W. Va., May 21, 1953, to Cuban's last defeat.

After many disappointments since he whipped Wallace in the 1949 Golden Gloves, Baker finally has buckled down to work. Since

Trouble lies ahead for Northern Division basketball teams as they near the end of their kings-X schedules.

In the next five days they will be facing some of the toughest competition of the pre-Pacific Coast Conference season. And most of it will be on foreign courts—in California, Kentucky, Ohio, Michigan and Kansas.

The Christmas holiday will give them a brief rest. Then they will close out the schedule in the Northern Division Classic at Seattle Dec. 28-29. Play for keeps in the regular season starts Jan. 3.

Oregon faces probably the roughest test, as the tuneup campaign draws to a close, meeting two of the nation's top-ranked teams, the Ducks play Louisville at Louisville Monday night, Dayton at Dayton, Ohio, Tuesday night and Detroit University at Detroit Wednesday night. Dayton was ranked No. 5 in the last Associated Press poll and Louisville No. 12.

Defending champion Oregon State and Washington also are on the road. OSC takes part in a doubleheader in San Francisco's Cow Palace, playing the University of San Francisco Friday night, and Santa Clara—the team that beat them at Corvallis earlier this month—Saturday night.
