## Farmers Deplore Damage By Ducks

HAXTUN, Colo. — Wild ducks feeding on northeastern Colorado corn fields have caused "hundreds of thousands of dollars" loss, indignantly farmers complain.

Meeting here Thursday night, more than 100 farmers from three counties joined in demanding the federal government reimburse them. They also asked that the present shooting hours be extended.

Loren Hovel, editor of the Haxtun Harvest, said the hundreds of thousands damage estimate covered the past 20 to 25 years. Farmers are drafting a claim to the government because the migrating birds are under federal protection.

## Increased Red Hostility Toward Allies Predicted

WASHINGTON (AP)—Russia may harden its attitude toward the West again early next year.

Such a switch would not necessarily reduce the chances which now appear to exist for improving basic contacts between Moscow and the rest of the world.

It would tend to increase tensions a little and to show more clearly the essentially antagonistic nature of Communist policy toward non-Communist nations.

These views are held by responsible Washington officials, some of them highly placed. The views are speculative. They are based on several considerations, including:

1. An assumption that Russia's plugging of "peaceful coexistence" during the past year has been aimed primarily at lulling West European countries into relaxation and thereby blocking the rearmament of West Germany.
  2. The reasonable certainty that, despite Russia's efforts, both France and Germany will ratify the pending agreements under which West Germany would be armed and made a member of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. The treaties last night passed a first reading in West Germany's lower house of Parliament.
  3. A belief that some degree of hostility toward the outside world is necessary to justify to people under any Red dictatorship the burdens and restraints imposed on them.
- Final European action on ratification of the various agreements or Germany is expected early next year. After that there may be Big Four foreign ministers' meeting. French Premier Pierre Men-

formally warned France that ratification of the German treaties will annul a French-Russian mutual assistance treaty signed in 1944. Even though the Soviet line on this is familiar, the formal notice is a fairly tough action.

Two days ago the Soviet Foreign Ministry announced in a broadcast from Moscow that Russia supports Red China's claim on Formosa and denounced the defense pact which the United States signed with Nationalist China earlier this month.

## Condon Story Release Asked

CHICAGO (AP)—The Atomic Scientists of Chicago said Thursday "the public has a right to know the full story" concerning clearance for Dr. Edward U. Condon and again asserted Vice President Nixon intervened in the case.

The organization of scientists acknowledged a denial Wednesday by Secretary of the Navy Thomas that intervention by Nixon was responsible for the Navy refusing clearance to Condon, former chief of the U.S. Bureau of Standards.

"We are glad to have Mr. Thomas' comment, because we feel that the record must be set straight," the ASC said in a statement.

However, the organization referred to an Oct. 23 story in The New York Times which it said quoted Nixon as saying, "Before I left Washington I asked that the Dr. Condon matter be re-examined."

Condon was cleared by the Eastern Industrial Review Board. Thomas told the ASC Wednesday the case was called to his attention by his staff and that he "withdrew clearance." Any secretary has the power to do this.

The ASC commented: "We are still very perturbed that the secretary of the Navy should overrule after less than 24 hours consideration, a decision in which the Eastern Industrial Review Board had labored for about a year."
