 "There will be lots of office parties this year and I shudder to think how merriment can so easily change to disaster on the way home."
 Hamilton listed several do's and don'ts received from the National Police Traffic Safety Institute, of which he is a member:
 1. If there must be an "office party," then use public transportation that day — don't drive.
 2. Moderation is the key to fun and safety.
 3. Remember those you love who aren't at the party, are waiting for you to return home safe and sound.
 4. "One-for-the-road" is a potential "murder weapon" in traffic.
 5. If you insist on driving to the party, don't hesitate to let someone else drive you home if you're feeling the least bit "gay."
 6. You may be happy when you leave the party — make sure others stay happy by not turning yourself into a "traffic menace."
 7. Never forget that your responsibility is for others, as well as yourself, when you drive. Remember little errors cause big accidents.

Drunk Driving Case Dismissed

A driving while intoxicated charge was dismissed late Thursday in the case of Herman M. Gallup, Klamath Falls millworker, who was on trial before a jury in District Judge D. E. Van Vactor's court.
 Judge Van Vactor dismissed the charge when it was shown by Defense Attorney Edwin E. Driscoll that a state policeman who arrested the defendant did not actually witness a law violation and had no warrant. The law requires an arrest for a misdemeanor, an officer either must have witnessed the violation or have a warrant.

According to testimony produced in court, Gallup was stopped on Highway 69 by County Juvenile Officer Francis Matnews. Matnews summoned a state policeman who then made the arrest.
 Judge Van Vactor ordered \$400 bail which Gallup had posted returned to the defendant.

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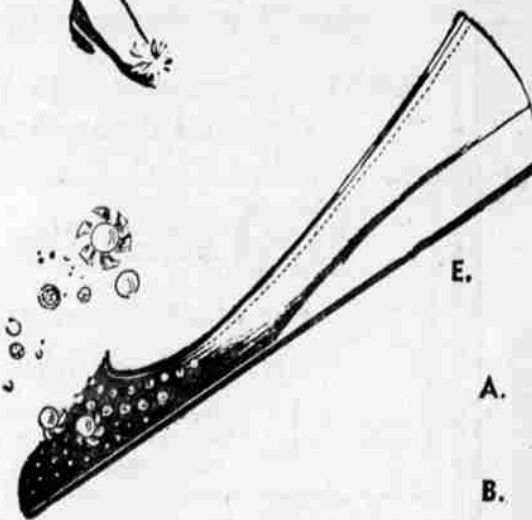
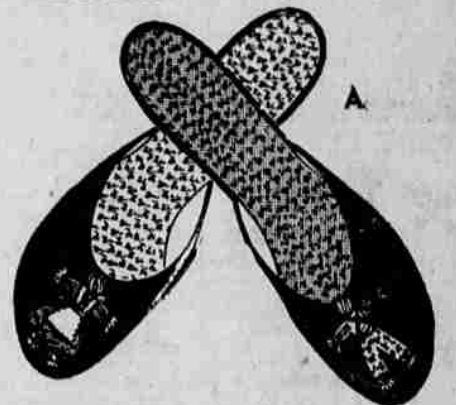
