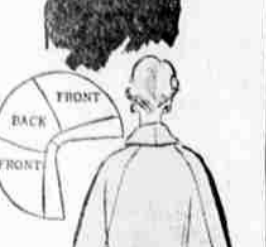

Demo Tells Of Candidate Fears

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Kerr (D-Ore.) said Monday Democrats are not nearly as afraid of President Eisenhower as they are of a Republican challenger.

Kerr's statement, made in an interview, was prompted by continuing discussions among Republicans and Democrats about Eisenhower's observation last week that he could make his decision now if he could accurately foresee the world and domestic situations and his own health.

Sen. Mundt (R-S.D.) said that as he interprets Eisenhower's remarks "they add up to the simple conclusion that he will run again."

"The world situation and the domestic situation will need his attention after '56," Mundt said. "I think the President will be convinced of that when the time comes."

"As for his health, we all know that his health is good and that he feels fine."

Charged with murder was 52-year-old William Ballinger.

Ballinger told homicide detectives he found Shirley Lee Mays, 25, Jefferson Ave., Ky., alone and asleep at the apartment of the 35-year-old woman early Sunday.

Ballinger said Mays woke up and asked him what he was doing there.

"I pay the rent here," Ballinger said.

"I pay the rent too," Mays replied.
