### Sicilian Farmer Puts In Hard Life Wrestling Crops From Tough Side Of Etna

ZAFFERANA ETNA, Sicily (AP)—Giovanni Barbagallo farms on the side of a volcano. Year after year he has felt the earth tremble beneath his feet, seen flames lash 500 feet into the air high above his farm, watched the red glow of lava creep down upon his orchard. Why does he stay?

The 60-year-old farmer shrugged as he watched the latest eruption of Mt. Etna.

"It's a living."

"I inherited the farm from my father before me. If I left, I would be unemployed. There would be nothing for me to hand on to my sons."

Danger? The bronzed farmer thought a moment.

"I have seen too many eruptions to give much thought to the danger. The worst is the work. It's hard farming up here. It is backbreaking hard."

There's a sort of family tradition, following the old pattern, like all of us who climb the mountain to our farms from Zafferana or Milo or Forzezzo or Passopisciaro or Linguaglossa.

"I was only 19 when I first started making the climb, to help my father."

"I can never tell you of the weariness, the long, long walk up trails twisting through the hard lava beds."

"Most of the way is by half light. We start long before dawn. We have to carry blankets and food for a week on our backs, to avoid making the trip dry."

Giovanni plants mostly rye, between rows of his apple and nut trees.

"It's not ordinary farming," Giovanni explained. "You can't use a plow on Etna. Her hide is too tough and too old. You have to spade by hand, with muscle. But the volcanic soil is rich. Crops are good."

### Turkey On Rough Road

ISTANBUL, Turkey (AP)—Turkey, southeastern anchor of NATO, is traveling an increasingly rocky economic road.

Prices are rising. Shortages have developed in some food and industrial items. The country has exhausted its foreign exchange and foreign credit is drying up. It is already heavily in debt.

Premier Adnan Menderes has inaugurated a series of measures designed to ease the situation—chiefly a crackdown on hoarders and speculators.

Western diplomats have been urging even more drastic measures.

Ironically, Turkey's problems stem from its own great energy, ambition and desire to complete the modernization begun 32 years ago by Kemal Ataturk. Since then Turkey has achieved remarkable economic progress for an underdeveloped, predominantly agricultural nation.

Menderes is pushing a development program that includes construction of five hydroelectric plants, 16 cement factories, sugar refineries, new port facilities, rail lines and roads. All this has been a heavy drain on the treasury and on foreign earnings and credits.

### Boy Injured In Bike Accident

Charles Nida, 12-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. F. S. Nida of the Stewart Lennox Addition is still in a serious condition at Klamath Valley Hospital following a bike-automobile collision August 5.

The boy met a car driven by Everett Randolph Jr., 19-years-old at the intersection of Douglas and Granite streets about 3 p.m. and was thrown violently to the pavement. He suffered multiple head injuries and has not regained consciousness. The accident occurred half a block from his home.

State police investigated the accident. No charge was filed against Randolph.
