

Chickens, Beef Best Bays Today

Beef and frying chickens will offer good value for shoppers in the nation's foodstores this week-end.

Once again, chuck roast will be prominently featured. It's a cut that most meat specialists consider particularly attractive for housewives with an eye on economy.

Prime ribs will be another popular special for Sunday dinner. And here and there, stores will offer lower prices on round roasts, cross-rib roasts and ground beef.

Frying chickens, not widely featured in recent weeks, will be back in the spotlight again. Quite a few markets will have turkeys at reasonable prices, too.

Legs of lamb, lamb shoulder roasts and pork loins are among other meats mentioned as specials by a number of markets. By and large prices are around week-ago levels.

The U. S. Department of Agriculture takes an optimistic view of meat prices in the months ahead. It looks for seasonal increases in production and says supplies will be larger than last year.

"The gain will be largely in pork, and prices will decline seasonally in late summer and this fall, especially on fresh pork," the department says. "Pork prices will stay below last year. Beef will be as plentiful as it was last year, with a larger proportion of better grade beef on the market."

"Consumers will find plenty of chickens available in the next few months," the USDA adds. "Retail prices of chickens have declined since April and may continue downward in the near future."

One important item of your diet is almost sure to cost you more this week—eggs. Leading markets are boosting prices of large grade "A" whites by two to 10 cents a dozen. These increases come on top of higher prices posted a week ago.

Humbog Creek Cabin Burned

YREKA — A cabin about a mile down Humbog Creek from the Humbog school was completely destroyed by fire Tuesday morning, the U. S. Forest Service reported here today.

The cabin, located on private property, was the residence of K. Taylor, according to fire dispatcher Lee Morford.

He said that the fire, which was reported at 9:34 a.m., was under control after completely destroying the house and all personal belongings inside it.

Cause of the blaze, which started inside the building, is still being investigated, Morford said.

Damage figures were not available today. Crews from Hill and Oak Knoll fire stations answered the call.
