MERRILL—Action on the 19th annual Klamath Basin Potato Festival moved into high gear August 9 at a called meeting of representatives of Merrill service and civic organizations and members of the Lions Club, sponsor club of the two-day fete. The meeting was called by Jim Kirby, president of the Lions Club.
Festival dates are Friday and Saturday, October 31-22. Kirby made tentative appointments to all committees and the list will be published upon confirmation by committee members.
The group went on record as favoring employment of a promotion director but no action on an appointee was taken.
Entries in the parades are invited from all organized groups and from individuals with attractive cash prizes to be given in the winning divisions.
Committees will seek increases in agricultural and commercial exhibits and it was suggested that a chairman will be sought in each agricultural district of the Basin to work with the central committee on plans for increasing exhibits of potatoes.
Work is under way on enlarging the gymnasium of the high school where agricultural exhibits have been on display in past years.
It is expected that the work will be completed by fair time.

Competition for queen of the festival will follow the same routine as in other years with candidates invited from high schools of the Basin.
