### Longtime Residents Honored With Farewell Dinner At Church

**SILVER LAKE** — Mr. and Mrs. Guy Martin were honored Sunday at a farewell dinner given by members of the Baptist Sunday School following services. The group presented the couple with a table lamp as a token of esteem and appreciation for their part in the work of the church.

Mr. and Mrs. Martin have purchased a home in Bend where they plan to move next week. They have sold their home here to Mr. and Mrs. Duane Crane. Crane is work until conservationist for the Fort Rock-Silver Lake Soil Conservation District.

Martin moved with his family to Silver Lake from Cottage Grove in 1895. His father, J. S. Martin, was in the livestock business. In 1919, after Guy's return from service in World War I he and his father purchased the Silvertooth and Lester Store.

Mrs. Martin came to Silver Lake in 1920 to teach grades seven and eight. She recalls holding classes in the parlor and dining room of the old Christmas Hotel while a new school was being built to replace the one destroyed by fire.

The Martins were married August 1, 1921. Martin began work with the U.S. Forest Service in 1929. When his father died in 1930 Mrs. Martin took over the running of the store. The present building, now the Silver Lake Mercantile, was built in 1940 and was called Martin's Mercantile. Mrs. Martin stated that when the move was made to the new store they discarded thousands of dollars worth of drug items that were stock of

the old drug store which adjoined their business. Labels had been lost and medicines were old. The Martins sold the store in November, 1949.
