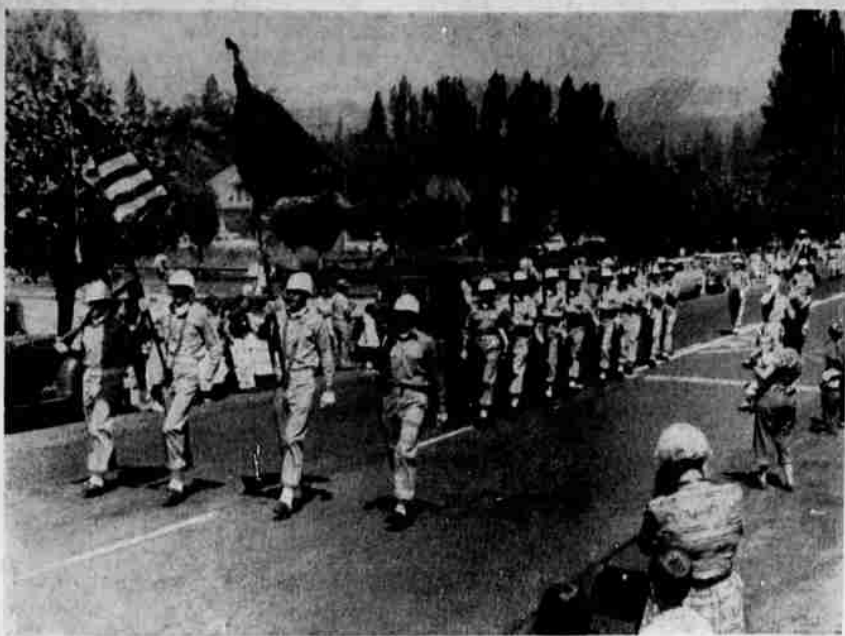

J. J. Errington talked with civic and chamber of commerce officials relative to FHA loans.

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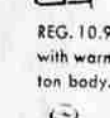

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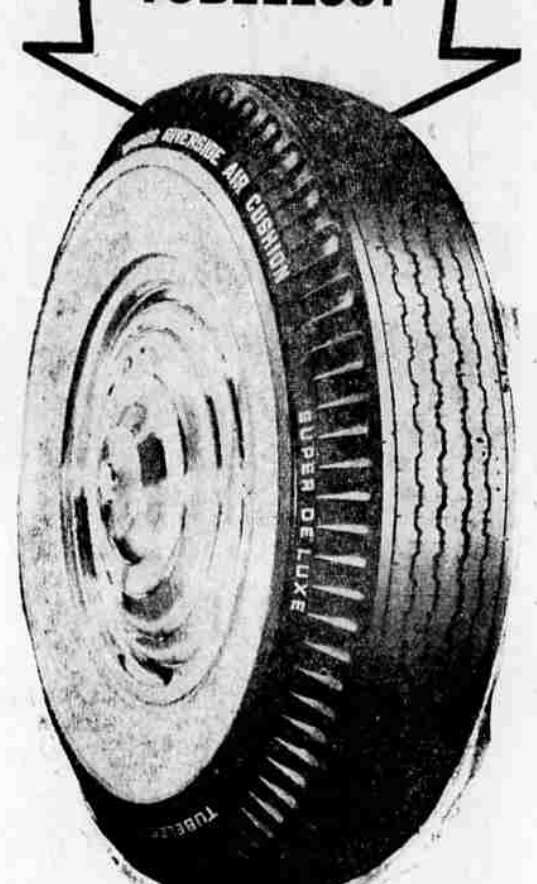
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
