There was a warm "Hi, Ike!" from the airport crowd and from his Lafayette Street neighbors as he flew in from Washington last night. And from the President, smiling broadly, it was "Hi, folks—it's sure nice to be here again."

Along with the chief executive came his beloved golf clubs, which he hoped to use today at Denver's Cherry Hills Country Club, and his trout-fishing gear for use in a stream high in the Rocky Mountains later in the week.
