

Morse Predicts GOP Defeat By Voters In '56 Election

WASHINGTON, Aug. 15.—Sen. Morse (D-Ore) continued Congress' post-session political sparring today with a prediction that the voters will toss "the Eisenhower administration out of office" next year.

Morse's forecast was in a statement replying to a contention by Chairman Bridges (R-NH) of the Senate GOP Policy Committee that party voting records showed Democrats had blocked key parts of President Eisenhower's domestic program.

The study tabulated which way the majority of each party's senators voted. Bridges said it showed Republicans were 92 per cent strong for the President's domestic policies; Democrats, 45 per cent.

Bridges' statement was an obvious plea to voters to return congressional control to Republicans next year. Democrats now have narrow margins in both the Senate and House.

Morse said Bridges' vote study "is typical Republican hokum" based on a "major false assumption, namely that all Eisenhower legislative recommendations were sound ones."

"Many were against the best interests of the American people," he said, and added: "I am proud that many Democrats did not swallow his reactionary program."

Meanwhile 12 Republican senators, none of them party leaders, issued their own blast at the Democratic-controlled Congress through the office of Sen. Allott (R-Colo.).

Allott, in an interview, denied that the group was staging a "young Turk" rebellion against Senate Republican Leader Knowland of California or other party leaders.

He said they were unable to reach Knowland or other Senate GOP leaders before the joint statement was issued.

The statement said the Democratic-controlled Congress was delaying or ignoring "some of the most important problems facing America today."

It noted lack of action at the recent session on Eisenhower requests for highway, school construction, health, atomic "peace ship" and other legislation.

"The delaying Democrats who are in control of the legislative committees of the Congress have postponed action on the President's proposals for meeting many of the nation's basic needs," the GOP statement said, adding: "The Democrats seem to be guided by politics rather than by the need of the nation."

From the Democratic side, Senate Leader Lyndon B. Johnson came out with a statement saying, "The country would be better served if the Republicans would take their eyes off the next election long enough to produce more than 29 votes for the highways (in a House vote) and to permit sober realistic consideration of school aid, health, immigration and other issues that remain before this Congress."

He said the session itself was "remarkably free of rancor and petty politics," and expressed regret that since adjournment some Republicans "appear to have caught election year fever in advance."

Allies Agree To Maintain Big Armies

WASHINGTON, Aug. 15.—America's European allies have agreed that the Western bloc must maintain its military power at the high level of the United States, Britain and France are to conduct further effective peace talks with the Russians.

Officials reported today that since the summit conference at Geneva last month there have been several exchanges of views in the North Atlantic Treaty Council at Paris. The 15 member governments are agreed, they said, that there is no evidence yet on the part of the Communists that would justify any changes in the scheduled Western defense buildup.

The Soviet government announced Friday night that it had decided to reduce Russian armed forces by 600,000 men by Dec. 15.

The United States, Britain and France are expected to confer early this week on the Soviet move. Over the weekend they welcomed it as a step in the direction of reducing armaments but they were frankly suspicious of whether the Soviets would make the full cut and just what Russian intentions were.

Barring some surprise move that would drastically alter Western thinking, they seem certain to go into the foreign ministers' conference with Russia at Geneva Oct. 27 in as strong a position as they held during the top-level talks last month.

But diplomatic experts are becoming increasingly uncertain how long this will be true. They expect Russia to make a big play in coming months for public opinion pressure to force cuts in Western arms expenditures and troop levels.

Their features cost them little and their promises cannot be checked.

Sen. Bennett (R-Utah) commented the Russian move "might have more meaning if we knew what percentage of total Russian military manpower it represents."

Sen. O'Mahoney (R-Wyo) said it should be viewed with "greatest caution." Sen. Watkins (R-Utah) called it "interesting but no reason for reducing our military strength in the slightest."

MOCK RAVIOLI CASSEROLE

Cook 6-oz. of butterfly or bow knot macaroni according to directions on package. Place cooked macaroni, sauce and green mixture in alternate layers in a 2-quart casserole. Bake in 350° F. oven for 1 hour. Serves 5 to 6.
