Foresters Fight California Fires

YREKA — Two fires were controlled by the California State Division of Forestry over the weekend. Bob Green, assistant ranger, reported that state forestry crews answered calls in Scott Valley and at another location, south of Yreka. About one-fourth acre of evergreen forest burned on the Martin ranch, about three miles north of Fort Jones. Damage was minor, Green said. The fire started from a spark from a harvester. About \$400 worth of damage was done when a chicken house, used for storage, burned on James Lauce's property on Oberlin Road, just south of Yreka, according to Green.

School Planning Registration

WEEK—Lena Lenz, principal of the Weed Elementary School, announced this week that registration for students planning to enter the Weed school this term and not previously registered will be held during the week of August 22 through August 26. School officials request that unregistered students and new kindergarten pupils register at this time between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 o'clock noon and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. at the school office. Proof of date of birth for kindergarten and first grade pupils must be furnished by parents in compliance with the California School Law. To enter the kindergarten class a child must be four years and nine months of age, and for first grade the child must be five years and nine months.

Freight Rate Battle Looms

Klamath County may lose its truck freight rate advantage over the Puget Sound area, it was disclosed Monday. The Seattle area has applied to the Interstate Commerce Commission for trucking rates equal to those of Portland to such areas as Southern Idaho and Utah. Should the commission grant the application, Klamath County's rates would be more in some instances than Seattle rates to those areas. In an effort to prevent the decrease in rates, the Klamath County Chamber of Commerce has filed with the ICC a petition to intervene. The chamber along with Portland representatives will ask that the decrease be denied on grounds that truck hauling distance is greater and that more mountainous roads are used in hauling from Seattle.

A hearing on the application has been set for September 19 in Seattle.

Examples of present list class rates now in effect are: Portland to Boise, \$3.49 a hundred pounds; Seattle to Boise, \$4.11; and Klamath Falls to Boise, \$4.03. Portland to Salt Lake City, \$4.35; Seattle to Salt Lake City, \$4.90; and Klamath Falls to Salt Lake City, \$4.69.
