### Highway Group Makes Plans

The Okanogan-Cariboo Trail Association may sound like a hunting club to the uninitiated. Needless to say, it isn't. In reality it is a group which was formed back in the 1920's to encourage traffic on Highway 97 to Canada, and to work for improvement of the north-south road. At first the organization encompassed the area from Kamloops, Canada to Wenatchee, Washington. Then it was mainly a friendship group to exchange ideas among members, which were hotels, motel and service station operators and restaurant owners. The organization soon began to extend and now has members from as far north as Dawson Creek in Canada and as far south as Weed in California. This includes all the waypoints in between, of which Klamath Falls is one. Every year association members hold a convention and travel to the site by motor caravan. The largest caravan in years is expected to make the trip this year to Prince George, British Columbia, where the convention will be held September 2 and 3. The caravan will begin at Wenatchee at 7 a.m. September 1. Cars will be added at each community along the route. Numerous activities are planned for the convention, including a parade, banquets, and speeches and panel discussions in the morning and afternoon. Membership in the association is open to anyone interested in the promotion of tourism along Highway 97 anywhere from Weed to Alaska. The local chamber of commerce has full details on the organization and on the motor caravan.

### Soil District Machine Offered

The Poe Valley Soil Conservation District has a new fertilizer spreader for use in pastures. The machine is called a "Pasture Dream" and is designed to place the fertilizer under the ground close to the feeder roots in an established pasture. The advantages of using this type of a machine are that there is a quick fertilizer response and more complete fertilizer recovery by the plants. Farmers who reside within the Poe Valley SCD may rent this machine at a nominal rate by contacting one of the district supervisors or Ben Murphy at Modoc Point.

The Klamath Experimental Farm and the Tulelake Experimental Farm played host to visiting barley experts on August 12 and 13. Dr. John Parker, director, Mailing Barley Improvement Association, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Orme Kellett and Jim Ennis, both with the Great Western Milling Company, Vancouver, Washington, spent the two days looking at experimental and field crops of mailing barley throughout the Klamath Basin. The men expressed great satisfaction in the types of experimental work on by the two experimental farms and stressed the fact that the present experiments are not designed to replace Klamath's noted Hamchen but it is hoped that experimentation will lead to an improved variety. They expressed concern over the proposed harvesting methods for the Kindred barley now in production in this area and indicated that the barley was at the stage where it should be windrowed for later combining. Parker gave a report on the kindred barley crop for 1955 and indicated that this year's barley crop would be the second largest of record, about 8 per cent over last year's crop.

## GOP Leaders Denounce Slur Cast By Demos On Hoover

Duff (R-Pa.) denounced this as a "silly political slur that reflects on those who made it," adding: "The Democrats will find they are not running against Mr. Hoover next year but against President Eisenhower." He said the Hoover Commission and its task forces "have rendered an outstanding, unselfish and highly patriotic service to the country." Sen. Bennett (R-Utah) said in a separate interview that the criticism of the former republican President shows "just how barren the Democrats are of real issues for a presidential campaign." "You'd think they would let Mr. Hoover finish his year of peace but they're running against him again," he said.

Sen. Williams (R-De.) said that "for 29 years the Democrats have been running against Hoover and maybe they figure they ought to try it again." Williams expressed the opinion that "the commission has done a good job and if we would carry out its recommendations we would save a tremendous amount of money." Sen. Knowland of California, the Republican leader, predicted that at its next session Congress will enact some—but not all—of the Hoover Commission proposals. The commission made extensive recommendations which it said would save the government up to \$1.5 billion dollars yearly. Congress failed to act on any of its major proposals in the last session. The commission said a total of 10 billions could be added to Treasury funds by the sale of surplus and unneeded property assets, liquidation of certain lending agencies and curtailment of the expenses of some bureaus. Democrats have assailed the commission's power report, which contended that the taxpayers are subsidizing the operations of multi-purpose data developments which benefit only 10 per cent of the public. The Digest article said that "in case after case," Hoover had "stacked" the task forces with men who have vested interests in a given point of view, and therefore cannot be considered detached experts. "Mr. Hoover's most flagrant abuse of this appointment author-

ity is his selection of the 26 persons making up the task force on water power and resource policy," the magazine said. "No one of the 26 represents what might be called the 'public power' point of view." The Digest said the previous Republican Congress changed the law so that the Hoover Commission, which under President Truman had been divided equally among Democrats and Republicans, was not required to be bipartisan. "But President Eisenhower must also bear a major responsibility, since it was his decision to fill his

four posts on the commission with three Republicans and only one Democrat, thus giving the GOP a 7-3 majority," the magazine said. It added, however, that subsequently "Mr. Eisenhower has carefully tried to avoid placing his stamp of approval directly on any specific recommendation of the Hoover Commission."

### Disarming Meet Plans Announced

WASHINGTON (AP)—The United States will concentrate, at this month's disarmament conference, on finding ways to prevent any nation from making a surprise atomic attack. Officials pointed up this approach today as a major U.S. goal which will come up for discussion at a meeting of a U.N. Disarmament subcommittee in New York Aug. 29. The United States, Britain, Russia, France and Canada will be represented. As one official put it, in talking of the possibilities last night: "If you can prevent a surprise attack, you can prevent any attack. With weapons as devastating as those which exist today, no nation will start a war without a surprise attack." As part of the plan, this country proposes to press for Russian acceptance of President Eisenhower's suggestion for exchange of military blueprints and aerial reconnaissance privileges, made at the Geneva summit conference.
