

Nixon Plans Brief Talks

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Vice President Nixon, winding up a brief Southern California vacation, arranged a series of private talks with political friends Wednesday.

He planned a breakfast with Mayor Norris Poulson, former Republican congressman. Talks with other personal and political friends will follow at the Biltmore Hotel. The vice president will have dinner privately with California's Republican congressmen and state legislators.

Nixon planned to fly back to Washington tomorrow. He arrived Aug. 9 with his wife and their daughters Julie and Patricia. They spent much of the vacation with Nixon's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Francis Nixon, of nearby La Habra.

Last night the vice president dedicated a flag and spoke at the opening of the weekly Musical Festival of the Americas in Hollywood Bowl, introduced by Mrs. Norman Chandler, president of the Hollywood Bowl Assn. He said:

"Many people will say that treaties of peace and friendship can be the source of world peace, but actually they mean nothing unless they are supported by the heart of the people, and any language that is as universal as music is certain to bring people together no matter if they actually understand the speech of their neighbors or not."

Wife's Reconciliation Hint Rejected By Airman Schmidt

SACRAMENTO (UP)—Una Schmidt, who remarried while her airman-husband was in a Communist prison, hinted Wednesday at a reconciliation, but Daniel Schmidt said "no."

Una, who said she married logger Alford Fine in September, 1954, in belief Schmidt was dead, was located publicly for the first time since Saturday through a call she placed to Schmidt's mother, Mrs. Nellie Peters of Portland.

The call came from San Jose, Calif. Mrs. Peters relayed Una's call about noon to Schmidt, who is in hiding here.

In an interview with United Press, Schmidt's attorney, Howard F. Welch, Sacramento, said "Una wants to sit down with Danny and his mother and talk this thing over."

Welch added: "I read into the conversation the possibility of an overture toward reconciliation. I haven't advised Dan whether he should take Una back. That is his personal decision. But he has flatly said he is not interested in reconciliation."

Welch announced earlier this week that Schmidt, shot down in a B-29 and imprisoned in Communist China, for 1 1/2 years, not only would seek a divorce but would demand custody of the couple's

two-year-old son, Daniel Jr.

Welch said he has talked to Una's attorney, Harold Berliner, of Nevada City, Calif., three times. "There was a question as to reconciliation. It was discussed," Welch admitted. "But I told Berliner that emphatically my client is against reconciliation."

"Whether we actually will have a meeting is something we will decide later. I see no particular legal value, but we don't want to be unreasonable," Welch said.

Welch said "Danny wants to be fair about everything. If they (Una and Fine) are having a bad time of it, he is not going to be unreasonable or bullheaded. We are not trying to assert our rights at the expense of everyone else."

However, Welch said, "Danny feels his right as a father exceeds

that of Una and Fine. He's a father that is entitled to make up for lost time."
