

Day Set For 49ers' Joe Perry

SAN FRANCISCO (UP) — Joe Perry, the combination forty niner fullback and offensive line player, will be honored with a special "Joe Perry Day" at Kezar stadium on Sunday.

About 40,000 fans are expected to be there to help hand out the good wishes — in fact, just about everybody will be honoring Joe and pulling for him except the Cleveland Browns.

Perry, the only man in history ever to gain more than 1,000 yards a season for two consecutive years in the National Professional Football League, obviously is interested in what he will receive from the fans.

NATURAL ENEMY
But the mention of Cleveland as an opponent takes front rank with him.

"Cleveland has been our natural enemy for many years," Perry said. "It is important that we beat them than what happens to me."

"If we can lick Cleveland, then I think we will have a good chance to win the championship. This is supposed to be only an exhibition game, but it will give us a good idea on our chances. More than any personal honor or record, I want to play on a championship team before I get around to retiring."

Joe isn't about to retire. He is only 28 years old and still regarded as the hardest runner in all of football.

In five years in the National League he has piled up 4116 yards. He ranks third in the all-time standings in the league. Only Steve Van Buren of the Philadelphia Eagles and Tony Canadeo of the Green Bay Packers have more yardage. Both have retired. Van Buren has 5,880 yards in eight years; Canadeo has 4,397 yards in 11 years. Perry should move into second place early in the season.

SHUTTER STEPPER
The 210-pound ball packer, who had only junior college experience before joining the Forty Niners when they were playing in the old All-American Conference, has averaged 5.3 yards per carry during his five years in the National League. This compares with 4.4 for Van Buren. The 1,401 yards Perry gained in the All-American league don't count in the National League records.

"The bruising fullback might have had more yardage if he had been used as an exhibition player," Perry said. "He has the stunner-step ability of a fleet halfback to go along with his battering-ram tactics. However, he is no bulldozer in the sense that Bronko Nagurski and Norm Standlee were. Rather than run over a tackle, Perry sidesteps."

Oakland and San Francisco both have proclaimed Sunday "Joe Perry Day" and the fans are going to give Joe and his wife enough furniture to completely fill a new house that Joe is exhibiting in return for all this. Perry expects to have his greatest season in packing the mail and give the fans a new set of thrills.

Golfers Open Labatt Action
MONTREAL (UP) — Canada's richest golf tournament, the \$26,800 Labatt Open, got underway today as 131 of the best pros and amateurs north and south of the border teed off in the first round of the 72-hole event.

The third annual Labatt Open, back at its original site of two years ago, the Summerlea Golf and Country Club in suburban Lacrosse, Que., was promised "perfect weather for the rest of the week." The 74 American and 57 Canadian players faced a "long" 6,515-yard, par-70 layout, beset by traps and streams.

PGA and All-American champion Doug Ford cut his professional teeth on the Labatt's winning the first with a 15-under-par 265 and placing second last year at Toronto's Scarborough course.

Ford shot practice rounds of 64 and 70 during the past two days. Arnold Palmer, who bolted into the limelight last week when he won the Canadian open at Toronto, liked the course "real well," but was unhappy about breaking in a new putter.

"Somebody walked off with it right after I finished the last round at Weston (site of the Open) last week," he said, "and I'm using two different replacements on the putting green."

"It's not quite the same. You get used to one putter and if you lose it, it may take a long time to get used to another."

Last year's U.S. Amateur champion from Latrobe, Pa., wanted a hot putter to win the Dominion Open with a near record 23-under-par 265.

Bob Huisacker, Apple Valley, Calif., pro was the defending champion but he appeared to be lost in the shuffle of top-scorer golfers shooting for the \$5,000 first money.

Carl Nyström, Michigan State's football captain was an all-around athlete in his school. He played football, basketball, baseball, ice hockey and tennis.
