Hot Weather Isn't Over

Cottage cheese, the versatile dairy food, has come a long way since little Miss Muffet's day. Remember the nursery rhyme... "Little Miss Muffet sat on a tuffet eating her curds and whey..." What were the curds and whey? Simply what is now called cottage cheese, with many refinements since little Miss Muffet enjoyed it. Today's cottage cheese is a versatile food especially popular with the modern Miss Muffet, who is watching her waistline. Its calorie content is low while its protein value is high. Salads are her favorite way for eating cottage cheese. Pictured here is a serve-yourself tray brimming with fruit and cottage cheese salads for Miss Muffet.

Cottage cheese blends happily with almost any fruit. With summer fresh fruit it tastes especially cooling and refreshing. Combined with cottage cheese in the photographed salads are pear strips, melon balls, peaches, pineapple and strawberries, apricots, and grapes and a peach half. Chopped pecans add texture contrast to the apricot-cottage cheese duo.

This tray of salads suits a ladies' luncheon to perfection. Add small sandwiches — nutbread or chicken salad, and a cool refreshing beverage. Your menu is complete.

Use fresh cottage cheese when you make these salads. Cottage cheese should always be used within a day or two after purchase to enjoy its delicate dairy flavor.

Cottage cheese should be kept tightly covered and in the refrigerator until you're ready to serve as it tastes best cold.

For more interesting salads, combine cottage cheese with any of these contrasting flavors — blue cheese, crushed pineapple, chopped dried beef, tomato cubes, minced chives, chopped green pepper, thinly sliced radishes, or pimiento.

There's a variety of other ways cottage cheese can be used. Try it in salad dressings, main dishes, appetizers, dips, salads and desserts.

A luscious Coconut Whipped Cream Dressing—like this—makes any fruit salad dessert look and taste more delectable. For 1 cup of dressing fold 2 teaspoons orange juice, 2 teaspoons sugar, a dash of salt and 1/4 cup of cut, shredded coconut into 1/2 cup of cream, already whipped.

BED TOO SHORT?

The growing popularity of the new super-size bedding brings up, for many people, the important question of how to convert their regular beds to the new size.

There's actually nothing complicated about it. A pair of bed rail extenders attached to the bed rails will lengthen them enough to take super-size bedding. They slip into place in a matter of seconds.

The extender is made of metal and comes in three lengths: 6, 8, and 10 inches. They are finished in all the popular wood tones for easy blending.

QUICK DESSERT
For an "entertaining" dessert sauce that's simple to make, combine 2 cups sliced fresh strawberries and 1/2 cup sugar and let stand 20 minutes. Drain and add enough water to juice to make 1 1/2 cups. Add 2 tablespoons quick-cooking tapioca and a dash of salt to juice and cook and stir over medium heat until mixture comes to a boil. Remove from heat, add 2 tablespoons lemon juice and the strawberries. Serve warm.
