KF Woman To Retire

Mrs. Kenneth H. (Louise) Estes, who started to work for the Pacific Telephone Company in Salem on July 16, 1918, will retire on Friday, August 26, from her duties as supervisor in the local telephone office. Announcement of her retirement was made today by Howard Austin, local manager of the telephone company and by Mrs. Estes.

She came to Klamath Falls in 1929 when the telephone office was on Seventh Street. During World War II the telephone company took over the operation of signal offices in Army camps and Mrs. Estes was transferred to Camp Adair, near Albany, Oregon; from there to Camp Abbott, near Bend and later to the Marine Barracks near Klamath Falls. At the end of the war years she returned to her position at the local office.

In announcing her retirement, Mrs. Estes stated that she has seen radical changes in telephone service to the public during her 37 years of service. She plans to spend some time at the family's summer home at Lake of the Woods and later to do some traveling with her husband.
