General Warns Of Red Power

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Gen. Nathan F. Twining said today "the Soviets are ahead of us" in their rate of progress at developing advanced military aircraft.

"This is not to say that Soviet air power now surpasses our own," said Twining, Air Force chief of staff. "It does not."

But he said the Russian challenge must be met "with startling progress of our own."

In an article prepared for distribution at the National Aircraft Show here Sept. 3-5, he said:

"If we should be forced into another war, our unquestioned ability to outproduce any nation will be of small value. The decision in that war would depend on the quality of the weapons that we would have when the war began."

He said the Soviet Union in the past several months has shown the world "that it too has acquired the ability to produce high quality airplanes in very large numbers."

He said that as of now, the Soviets cannot outproduce this country. "nor can anyone say that Soviet aircraft are more advanced than ours, for they are not."

"However, there is one way that the Soviets are ahead of us," he said. "They are ahead in rate of progress."

our school children get the right perspective of business operations."

The Tuesday program is part of Teachers' Institute week which begins Monday and runs through Friday of next week. Credit will be given teachers by the state school system for their participation.

Final preparation for the morning program were made Wednesday noon at a luncheon of some 35 business leaders and school heads.

It was emphasized the importance of "getting across" to the teachers the virtues of the free enterprise system and of how it works.

It is important the teachers be fully explained this so that it may be passed on to their students, H. Frank Tucker, chamber manager, told the group at the Winema Hotel.

"What happens to education," Tucker asserted, "happens to America."

He said this year there will be close to six and a half million more children in the nation's schools than in 1950.

The teachers will assemble at Mills School at 8:50 Tuesday morning, and will be taken to the respective business firms in school buses.

They will return to Mills School at 11:30 a.m.

At a firm they will be wel-

comed by one of its chief executives; tour the plant or store; be given a word outline of what business contributes to Klamath Falls and Klamath County; be given an explanation of how the firm handles its employment, education and training program; be pointed out the problems of business and industry in the community and throughout the country; and they will be explained the importance of maintaining all the country's freedoms.

Following the tour and as part of the in-service training program teachers participating will report on the days activity.

They will be required to answer the following questions about the firms they visited:

What business firm did you visit; was the representative of the firm well prepared for the day (to be answered, excellent, good, fair or unsatisfactory); was the story of the free enterprise system explained to your satisfaction; do you have a better understanding of the problems of business after this visit; in general statement how could the day be improved; what suggestions do you have for the preliminary preparation B-E Day; what type of follow-up program should be used; and what specific firm would you like to visit next year.

B-E day has been conducted here for the last several years.
