Morse Says He Can Win Votes

PORTLAND (AP)—Wayne Morse said Thursday he is confident of winning reelection as U. S. senator against any candidate Oregon Republicans nominate.

He told reporters "it doesn't make any difference" who it is. Morse, returning home from the recent session of Congress in Washington, would not guess who his opponent might be. Anyway, he said, the people would be voting for or against him more than they would be for his opponent.

Morse expressed belief that Adlai Stevenson would be the Democratic presidential nominee and that he would defeat President Eisenhower. He questioned the accuracy of polls showing Eisenhower with a high popularity rating.

Morse was critical of Congress for not staying in session until it passed several pieces of important legislation. He said he believes next year Congress should give first attention to legislation providing more federal aid for highway construction, aid to education, improvement of social security laws, strengthening anti-trust laws, farm price increases, and to stiffening the corrupt practices law.

Morse will address a Democratic picnic here Sunday. Later he will go to Los Angeles to speak at a Labor Day meeting.

U.S. Asks No Veto In Atom Peace Plan

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (AP)—The United States wants a veto-free agency controlled by 16 nations to operate the proposed international atom-for-peace program. The United States and the Soviet Union would be among the 16 members of the agency's governing board.

Diplomatic sources here last night disclosed details of the "confidential" American plan, which the U.S. delegation to the U.N. has circulated for study and comment to the more than 70 countries in the U.N. or its specialized agencies.

The Russians turned down a similar American proposal at Disarmament subcommittee meetings last year in London. The Soviet objection to the agency's independence from the Security Council—where the Russians wield a veto. The U.S. plan will be debated in the General Assembly sessions opening here Sept. 20.

Diplomatic sources gave this outline: 1. The atom-for-peace agency would buy or receive donations of nuclear materials and sell them at cost to countries needing them. It would be a clearing house also for information on production and use of nuclear energy.

2. All members of the U.N. or its specialized agencies could join the agency.

3. The 16 nations of the governing board would include (A) the five nations now in the forefront of atomic research or production—the United States, Britain, France, Canada and the Soviet Union; (B) the five other countries now producing atomic raw materials—South Africa, Portugal, Belgium, Australia and Czechoslovakia; and (C) six other nations elected by the atomic council.

4. A majority vote would prevail in decisions of the governing board. No country would have a veto.

Shasta Filter Plant Cost Told

YREKA—The cost of setting up a plant to filter water from the Shasta River would cost from \$75,000 to \$125,000 per million gallons of daily capacity, according to the report of a chemical engineer. Daily water use at Yreka runs about 1,700,000 gallons, according to C. M. Potter, water supervisor.

Members of the Yreka City Council will meet with K. N. Brown, a water expert, in September, to discuss the possibility of a chemical purification plan such as are in operation at Auburn and Sonora, California.
