THE CAMERA CORNER

If you're looking for a movie camera, what'll you have... 8mm or 16mm? The initial cost is about the same, but the cost of operating the 8mm is about half because of the smaller picture frame. Now how about the different uses of these two cameras?



The 16mm picture frame has about 4 times the area of an 8mm frame... so it goes without saying that more detail can be packed into the larger frame. Is this detail necessary? The answer is "yes" when you're making the long shots where distant detail is needed, or when you want to project the film on a large size for viewing by a large audience. But in close-up shots on a small projection screen, minute detail loses its importance in movies.

This gives you an important clue on which to base your choice between the two camera sizes. If your work will be confined to home showing on a small screen, and confined mostly to close-up shots of family, friends and interesting scenes from your vacations, then an 8mm motion picture camera might serve your needs admirably. If you have any thought of doing a lot of distant photography where detail is important, or if you might show your films on a large screen, then a 16mm camera and projector is your best bet. (And if you ever wanted to market movie film, it would have to be 16mm.)

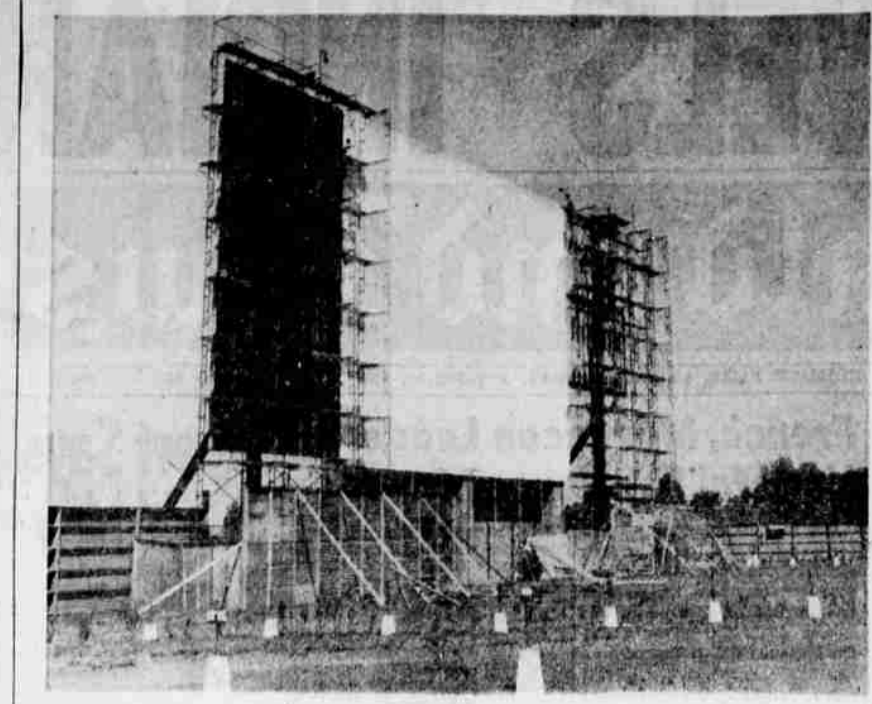

Guy Lombardo Show Slated

Guy Lombardo, known far and wide as the purveyor of "the sweetest music this side of heaven" makes his initial appearance in Klamath Falls September 24 at the fairgrounds.

The famous maestro has had a Horatio Alger-like career. He and his Royal Canadians have an almost legendary place in the annals of American music.

A native of London, Ontario, Lombardo was launched on his career with a four-piece band while in grammar school. The orchestra, which included himself as violinist, Carmen Lombardo as flutist, Lebert Lombardo as drummer, and Fred Kreitzer as pianist, are all still with the band.

At first, the Lombardo group played at church socials and other community gatherings. Then an American booking agent got wind of the outfit. He signed Lombardo and his boys for an Elks convention in Cleveland, Ohio.

By 1929, Lombardo had won national recognition. The band went to the Roosevelt Hotel in New York and they have played the famous history case fall and winter since. Guy Lombardo is credited with introducing at least half of the country's song hits each year.

Baldy Evans, who booked the Lombardo band for Klamath Falls, is making elaborate preparations for the dance in the fairgrounds exhibit building. A new bandstand and a special lighting system will be installed, Evans said he is presenting Lombardo at the fair grounds because of more floor and parking space.

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP) — Premier Tage Erlander opened Stockholm's annual St. Erik's fair Saturday. American and Russian goods are displayed side by side for the first time in Europe.

USAF Cancels Slated Ouster

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Air Force Saturday quashed ouster proceedings against a young reservist who had been accused of associating with his father, an alleged former Communist or Red sympathizer.

Secretary of the Air Force Quarles ruled that Airman 3C Stephen Branzovich, 22, of Farrell, Pa., is not a security risk.

The ruling came virtually on the eve of a Senate investigation, scheduled next week, into the Eisenhower administration's handling of security risk charges.

Among other things, the probe will look into several cases in which government agencies cracked down on employees, reportedly because they associated with parents, husbands or wives alleged to have links with Communism.

Branzovich had been scheduled to appear before a special board next Tuesday to answer ouster charges.

Quarles, announcing he had determined after personally reviewing the case that Branzovich's continued membership in the reserve "is consistent with the interests of the national security," said there would be no hearing.
