Klamath Lions Stage Ticket Sale For Tech

Members of the Klamath Falls Lions Club have opened a double-barreled campaign aimed at the promotion of football ticket sales for the Oregon Tech gridiron season.

John Schubert, spokesman for the Lions, said today, his service club took it upon themselves to initiate some sort of a promotional program to help make OTI football a success. In doing so they came up with the idea of a service club ticket selling contest.

To kick off this program, members of the Lions issued a challenge to the Klamath Kiwanis who in turn accepted. The Toketeo Lions and the Junior Chamber of Commerce are also expected to enter into the selling contest.

Each club will be responsible for one game. The Lions will take the OTI-Seattle Rambler game which opens the season here on September 21. The Kiwanis and other clubs will take their turns as the home names come.

The club drawing the largest attendance to a single game will be declared the winner of the contest and some sort of a trophy will be presented to the winner.

Hardtops Plan Two Programs

Klamath Basin racing fans are in for a big weekend as the Klamath Racing Association has scheduled a double Labor Day Weekend hardtop show Friday and Sunday.

The rough and tumble bullies of the auto racing world will take the Klamath Speedway quarter mile track Friday evening starting with time trials at 7 o'clock, then again Sunday afternoon at 4:30.

Since the new speedway oval opened for business, more and more Basin auto racing enthusiasts have been enjoying the weekly programs, and this weekend's twin-bill is expected to carry on the same style of dog-eat-dog battling.

Last week Bob Crawley moved into a tie for the lead of main event winners' list by posting his fourth A-main triumph of the year. Allan Bousman has also snared the checkered flag on four different occasions. Bousman led the point race going into last week's program, but Crawley was in third place just a hop-skip and a jump from Bousman and second place holder Ray Brackman.

Crawley and Bousman will both be out to snare main event number five Friday night and Sunday in the late afternoon, early evening program. Other top drivers who have been making a strong bid in the recent shows to displace Bousman and Crawley as the top winners have been Johnny Hilson, Benny Morrison, Bud Cook and Glenn Stevens. Hilson was last year's high point driver.

The full racing card will be held for the speeding spectators. The two trophy events of four laps apiece will open the program followed by three or four heat races. If track officials stage three heats, then a final heat will be held. The top three cars in the heat races will vie for honors in the 10 lap final heat battle. A 15-lap B-main and 25-lap A-main will complete the schedule. In Sunday's two-night affair a special event may be added to the program.

Portland Blasts Seattle; Hollywood Beaten

Hollywood ace Bob Garber served up one homerun ball too many last night and the Stars missed a golden opportunity to grab first place in the Pacific Coast League away from Seattle. The Twink 20-game winner had a 1-0 lead going into the bottom of the eighth in Los Angeles when Solly Drake homered to tie it up. Leadoff batter Gale Wade followed up in the ninth for the round-tripper that gave the Angels the 2-1 win.

Meanwhile, the front-running Rainiers bowed to Portland, 5-2. That left Seattle just 0008 of a point ahead of Hollywood with 15 games to play.

Portland's win lifted the Beavers into third place, 0003 of a point ahead of idle San Diego and 4 1/2 games off the pace.

In the only other game played, Oakland romped past San Francisco, 10-3, as rookie lefthander Fred Besana helped his cause with a grand-slam homer.

Hollywood's Garber engaged in a scoreless duel with Joe Hatten until the seventh inning when Bobby Prescott singled home Carlos Bernier to put the Stars ahead. Garber allowed only three hits before the Angels began to hit for the distance. He struck out 13 and

walked only one in suffering his 14th defeat.

Hatten was lifted for a pinch-hitter in the eighth and Turk Lown finished to take the win, his 10th against five losses.

In Portland, the Beavers handed the PCL's leading pitcher, Lou Kretlow, his second defeat. He has won 13.

Bill Werle limited the Rainiers to nine hits in posting his 15th win.

The Beavers came from behind in the second to take a 2-1 lead on a walk, singles by Jim Robertson and Don Eggert and Frank Austin's first of two run-scoring sacrifice flies.

After the Rainiers squared it in the sixth on Jerry Priddy's double and Leo Ribetti's single, Portland went ahead for good in the seventh. With the bases loaded, Carl Powis lotted a sacrifice fly and Kretlow uncorked a wild pitch for the second run.

Oakland's lopsided win enabled the Oaks to climb out of the cel-

lar over San Francisco. Besana had a great night at the plate, knocking out two singles in addition to his homer with the bases loaded in the eighth for a total of five runs batted in.
