Man Delivers Own Funeral Message

MESA, Ariz. (AP)—An executed murderer delivered his own funeral message yesterday—by tape recording.

About 450 persons at the First Baptist Church heard Lester Bartholomew's voice ask "all of you who are my friends, and those near to me" to "get right with God."

In the message recorded in death row, he said:

"Having faith will get you right with God.

"Adopt him as your Savior now. Don't wait.

"I hope to see all of you in Heaven.

"Bye-bye, now. Bye-bye."

Bartholomew died in the gas chamber Wednesday for shooting his wife and two children at their Phoenix home May 23.

ROME (UP) — I shall never cease to wonder why most human beings make such a fuss over meeting other human beings who happen to be movie stars! Is it because they have always thought of them as only shadows on the silver screen?

I personally wouldn't walk from here to there to look at a movie star or to meet one.

Well, maybe one—Garbo.

For with Garbo I should like to discuss our mutual doctor on the West Coast... and our diets. And I suppose in womanly fashion I'd discuss my wrinkles with her!

My first meeting with Garbo was when Hollywood was truly glamorous, when a party just wasn't a party unless Douglas Fairbanks and Mary Pickford were there.

And the Thalberg's (Nep Norma Shearer), Charles Chaplin, Marion Davies, Norma and Constance Talmadge, Jack Gilbert, Corinne Griffith, Ronald Colman, Richard and Jessica Barthelme, Carole Lombard and William Powell—and Clark Gable standing shyly in some corner.

In those days we were like a pack of kids which indeed we were. Nobody was in their forties which is where all of us are staying now.

It was the era of practical jokes. A day or a dinner party never went by without a prank. A plumber would arrive to warn you that the main water pipe in the street had burst and all water faucets had to be turned on full force. The plumber who created this Niagara faller in the land of make-believe might have been Buster Keaton or Zasu Pitts.

After dinner it was unusual if we didn't show a movie or play

games, or both. An actor's greatest pleasure is to act. So our favorite game was charades, now called "the game."

Sometimes Chaplin gave us a one-man show. His ingenious imagination could entertain us in pantomime for hours. Or Ronnie Colman, Warner Baxter or Chester Morris—all amateur prestidigitators—with their magic and card tricks.

I can truthfully deny the rumor that Hollywood parties were drunken brawls. I saw but one fight and must confess—I was the cause of it.

Or to be specific the cause of it was the extreme curiosity of John Saunders (Pay Wray's husband) and some innocent pink roses in my décolleté evening gown.

Were the roses real or artificial? My escort Herbert Marshall, objected to Mr. Sanders finding out. The fight in Ernest Lubitsch's house was on, and off, in a flash.

All this proves is that those shadows on the screen have flesh and human appetites and sometimes a curiosity that gets them into trouble, just like other human beings.
