School Rolls Show Increase

Enrollment of Klamath Falls public schools has increased by 37 over last year's, official count disclosed today.

This year's total is 2,387 while last year 2,350 students attended the city schools.

Klamath Union High School's enrollment for 1955 is 1,438 against 1,396 for 1954.

This year there are 409 freshmen, 390 sophomores, 247 juniors and 290 seniors.

Conger School's enrollment is 207; Fairview, 341; Fremont, 138; Junior High, 259; Mills, 676; Pelican, 238; Riverside, 195; and Roosevelt, 333.

Youth Faces Death Charge

YREKA — Vincent Alcantar, 18, of Oakland, arrested for illegal possession of alcoholic beverages in his auto after being involved in a fatal accident August 31, was arraigned Thursday afternoon on an additional charge of manslaughter.

Bail was set at \$2,500 and date of preliminary hearing is September 14.

Alcantar was driver of an auto in which James Richard Rose Jr., 15, of Yreka suffered fatal injuries when the car failed to make a curve on the Fort Jones-Yreka road.

He appeared Thursday in the court of Judicial Judge E. M. Ax-tell, who sentenced him to 10 days in the county jail on the liquor charge and informed him of the manslaughter charge.

The Rose boy was killed and another passenger, Samuel Pries-haur, 19, of Fort Jones, was slightly injured in the accident. Alcantar was unhurt. The accident occurred when the eastbound auto failed to make a curve near Forest House at the eastern end of the Forest Mountain grade.

Rose had hitchhiked his ride in the car, California Highway Patrolmen indicated.

Meanwhile, funeral services for Rose were held at 2 p.m. Tuesday at Girdner's funeral chapel in Yreka. Interment was in Ever-green Cemetery.

In addition to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. James Richard (Dick) Rose, he is survived by his maternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. John Jones of Montague, and numerous aunts and uncles.
