Red Sox, Pale Hose Post Wins

The cocky Cleveland Indians have come up with a pair of professional "bouncers" to take care of any club that may have a notion to knock them out of first place.

The two pros who are doing all the heavy work for the Indians are Larry Doby and Early Wynn. Doby took care of all the hitting Wednesday night, driving in four runs against Baltimore with a pair of homers, while Wynn took care of the pitching with a nifty five-hitter in a 6-0 victory over the Orioles.

When Doby and Wynn were through mopping up, the Indians still were a half-game ahead of the second-place Yankees, who defeated the Athletics, 2-1, and 1½ games ahead of the third-place White Sox, who eked out a 4-3 decision over the Senators.

POSTS 200TH

Wynn, in registering his 16th victory of the year and his sixth shut-out, posted the 200th triumph of his career. The only other active major leaguer with over 200 victories is teammate Bob Feller, who has won 266.

Southpaw Whitey Ford of the Yankees hurled his second straight one-hitter to beat Kansas City. Only Jim Fingers' looping double to right field with two out in the seventh inning deprived Ford of a no-hitter.

Dixie Howell, the workhorse of the White Sox pitching staff, had to be summoned from the bullpen in the ninth inning to save Jack Harshman's victory over Washington.

The Red Sox hopped on rookie Jim Bunning for five runs in the first two innings and went on to defeat the Tigers, 7-4. Frank Sullivan was credited with his 17th victory although he needed relief from Ellis Kinder after Frank House homered with one out in the ninth.

TIE CLINCHED

The Dodgers clinched at least a tie for the National League flag by licking the Braves, 3-1. Another Brooklyn victory over Milwaukee today will enable the Dodgers to clinch the pennant on the earliest date in league history. They set the current record when they won the 1953 flag on Sept. 12 of that year.

Righthander Bob Friend of the Pirates turned in the second one-hitter of the day in beating the Cubs, 2-0. Frank Baumholtz, infield single in the fourth inning deprived Friend of the first perfect game since 1922 as the Pirate hurler struck out eight and walked none.

Southpaw Johnny Antonelli, who was suspended during the week-end for "insubordination" and then reinstated, pitched the Giants to an 8-2 victory over the Cardinals.

A fine relief job by Johnny Klippstein helped Cincinnati to a 6-3 victory over Philadelphia. Klippstein held the Phils to one hit over the last 6½ innings after succeeding Art Fowler.

Pre-Season Grid Vote Picks Uclans As Top

UCLA, the team the experts decided was only second best last fall, is the preseason pick for the 1955 national championship of college football.

But the Uclans, defending champions of the Pacific Coast Conference, barely gained the most-likely-to-succeed billing in a three-way voting scrap with Oklahoma and Michigan in The Associated Press' annual preseason balloting.

Sports writers and broadcasters of the nation gave Coach Red Sanders' Bruins a mere 53-point margin over Oklahoma, UCLA, gathering 10 points for a first-place ballot, 9 for second, 8 for third, etc., totaled 1,054. Oklahoma had 1,001.

But Michigan, generally picked to succeed last year's national champion Ohio State as the ruler of the Big Ten, passed both UCLA and Oklahoma in a first-place vote. The Wolverines were accorded the No. 1 spot on 34 of the 135 ballots cast. UCLA had 33, Oklahoma 32.

Michigan, however, totaled only 670 points in the combined tally of the nation and settled for third place in the preseason rankings.

Next came Ohio State, Maryland, Notre Dame, Army, Navy, Miami (Fla.) and Georgia Tech.

The final '54 ballot listed Ohio State, UCLA, Oklahoma, Notre Dame, Navy, Mississippi, Army, Maryland, Wisconsin and Arkansas.

Vic Seixas, Trabert Meet Aussie Stars

FOREST HILLS, N.Y. (UPI)—A replay of America's disastrous opening day in the Davis Cup challenge round is building up for Saturday's semi-finals in the U.S. Tennis Championships as Vic Seixas and Tony Trabert cut through the field for a vengeance showdown against Ken Rosewall and Lew Hoad of Australia.

Seixas, 32-year-old defending champion from Philadelphia, made his bid today for a berth in the semi-finals in a match against Bernard Barten of San Angelo, Tex., while Rosewall was favored to bag the slot just below him by downing three-seeded Hamilton Richardson of Baton Rouge, La.

Hoad and Trabert, idle today, tackle the remaining two survivors on Friday with Hoad against 21-year-old Sammy Giammalva of Houston and Trabert battling Hebble Flann of Beverly Hills, Calif., who scored the biggest upset of the men's tournament Wednesday by whipping Australia's Rex Hartwig, 6-4, 6-2, 6-2.

Thus, if the four aces top the four underdogs in the next two days, the stage will be set for Saturday's semi-finals exactly as it was when the U.S. undertook its futile defense of the Davis Cup on Aug. 26—Seixas vs. Rosewall and Trabert vs. Hoad. The Aussies won both matches and virtually clinched the Davis Cup right there.

In the women's championship, tiny Belmar Gunderson of Fort Meade, Md., celebrated her 21st birthday Wednesday by ousting Wimbledon champion Louise Brough, two matches were scheduled to set up the upper bracket semifinal for Saturday.

Defending champion Doris Hart of Coral Gables, Fla., was paired against Mrs. Nancy Chaffee Kiner of Cleveland and Dorothy Head Knodel of New York against Shirley Fry of St. Petersburg, Fla.

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Top Golf Names In Open Play

SCOTCH PLAINS, N.J. (UPI)—Jack Fleck, Doug Ford, Cary Middlecoff, Sam Snead and 153 other players begin the 72-hole Cavalcade of Golf Open Tournament today for \$50,000 in prizes.

The richest tournament ever staged in the metropolitan area drew virtually every star on the current tournament circuit. The field also includes Mike Souchak, Jack Burke, Gene Littler, Arnold Palmer, Tommy Bolt, Ed Furgol, Lloyd Mangrum, Chandler Harper and Bob Toski.

The tournament sponsors will hand out 45 cash prizes but the big attractions for the pros are the \$10,000 first money and \$5,000 second money.

STILL TRYING

Tim Holland, former Long Island amateur champion, is president of the organization which is conducting the tournament. If it proves a success, other similar tournaments will be held in various parts of the country on an annual basis, he said.

UCLA, Southern Cal Rated Tough Teams In Coast Race

BERKELEY, Calif. (NEA)—Unquestionably the strongest
