A CHEESE TRAY can't be beat as a way to serve snacks. It has color, taste variety and ease of preparation—and you can get at least seven varieties of cheese for finger eating here in Klamath Falls. Even if you don't think of the Klamath Basin primarily as a dairying area, our producers are top grade and many of the finest cheeses in the country are made right here. The miniature kabobs pictured are tiny square slices of Swiss cheese and ham with pineapple chunks. The combination can be varied by substituting stuffed olives, cocktail onions or sweet pickle halves for the pineapple. The radish-centered bowl of what appears to be cottage cheese is actually a nippy dip. This tray follows the cardinal rule for all cheese trays. It offers a variety of cheese—sharp, mild, hard, soft.

Household Bleach Is Not Harmful To Septic Tanks

To bleach or not to bleach—that is the question so often asked by septic tank owners. The answer is "yes"—you can and should use household bleach regularly to save time and work and, more important, to give your family extra health security.

If you're troubled by the thought that waste water containing household bleach might impair the bacterial action of your septic tank, stop worrying. Scientists tell us that regular household and farm use of this efficient germ-killer will not affect septic tank operation.

This should be welcome news to many homemakers because a hypochlorite bleach such as Clorox, does more than just make clothes white—it is outstanding among disinfectants recommended by hundreds of public health departments.

Let's see what this means to you and your family. First, we'll consider washing because there's hardly a household in America where at least part of the family laundry isn't done in the home. A liquid chlorine bleach added to your soaking suds, washing suds or rinse water will make cottons and linens hygienically clean, besides bleaching, removing stains and deodorizing.

Freezer Meals

An entire menu can be prepared in advance and stored in the home freezer or the freezing compartment of your refrigerator.

Here are some suggestions from Mrs. Sara Walls, Amnara freezer home economics director.

Hamburgers can be preshaped, ready for grilling, or wrapped individually in foil (perhaps with a cheese slice or spoonful of barbecue sauce) to go right into the coals or the oven. Serve picnic style in the foil wrapper and you'll cut down on the dishwashing, too. Kabobs of steak, mushrooms and bacon; ham, pineapple chunks and stuffed olives; or beef balls, cheese cubes and tiny cooked new potatoes all can be prepared and stored in the freezer.

Split and butter a supply of hamburger and wiener buns and keep them in the freezer so they'll be ready at a moment's notice.

Several freezer containers of chili, a meat loaf, barbecued spareribs, chop suey, baked beans, shrimp creole, even a good, rich chowder, can be tucked into the picnic corner of the freezer. Be sure to include plenty of your favorite barbecue sauce for basting steaks, hamburgers, pork chops, or chicken.

It's a good time to consider your frozen corn on the cob, too. With each ear wrapped in foil include a pat of butter. You can roast it right in the coals or oven. Toss up a crisp salad to complete the meal.

Breads and desserts can also be frozen. It's a wise homemaker who keeps a supply of frozen sandwiches for pack-and-go picnics. Spread the bread with softened butter to prevent fillings from soaking the bread. Cold cuts, cheese, peanut butter alone or in combination with bacon, pickle relish, jelly or marmalade, are some filling suggestions.

SUGAR

Summertime is the time when we use the most sugar. It's additional uses are in soft drinks, ice cream, glasses of iced tea, on breakfast berries and in fresh fruit desserts.

It is also the season when nature puts more sugar in her sun-ripened fruits and in garden-fresh vegetables—the same kind of sugar she puts in sugar cane and sugar beets.

Yet this is the time of year when most people find it easier to shed surplus pounds.

Science has just recently given us the reason. Sugar plays a part in the healthy body's own weight control system.

Sugar is known as quick-energy

food because it raises your blood level almost immediately. Now research scientists have found that the blood sugar level also helps to regulate appetite.

When your blood sugar level is low you get hungry. That's your body-call for energy. When you eat, your blood sugar level goes up. When it reaches a certain point, your hunger stops. You find it is easier to turn down extra helpings that lead to extra weight.

This explains why your summertime use of sugar helps you to stay satisfied on lighter summer meals.

A level teaspoonful of sugar contains only 18 calories. A between-meal glass of fruit juice or sugar-sweetened soft drink, or even a piece of candy, can help you cut several times as many calories from the next meal.

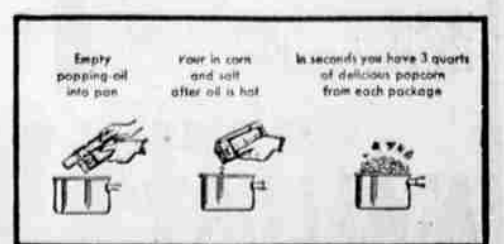
