Gaza Strip Wire Fence Asked U.N.

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (UP)—The Western Big Three powers asked the United Nations Security Council today for a barbed wire fence along the Egyptian-Israeli border to prevent further outbreaks of fighting.
The 11-nation council met at the request of the United States, Britain and France to consider a proposal that the armed forces of the two nations be separated by a "physical barrier."
The explosive Palestine crisis momentarily diverted attention from East-West disarmament talks. Informed sources speculated that the United States might at last reply to President Eisenhower's military inspection plan at today's session.
The Big Three specifically called for approval of recommendations by Canadian Maj. Gen. E. L. M. Burns, chief U.N. Palestine truce supervisor, that "the armed forces of both parties should be clearly and effectively separated."
Burns said he was convinced further violence could be averted only if "the forces of the opposing sides are separated by an effective physical barrier."
Burns' report to the United Nations said that between Aug. 22 and Sept. 1 56 persons were killed and 39 injured in fighting along the truce line. The dead included 43 Egyptians and 13 Israelis. An uneasy ceasefire is in effect now.
