

Road Crashes Claim 6 Lives

SAN FRANCISCO (UP) — The Highway Patrol today reported six persons were killed in Northern California in weekend traffic accidents.

Donald Starke, 15, Bakersfield, was killed yesterday when a car he was riding in veered off Highway 178 and plunged into Kern River about 10 miles northwest of Bakersfield.

Idaho Power Files Plans

BOISE (AP) — Idaho Power Co. took another step Monday along the thorny path toward construction of three private dams in the Hells Canyon reach of the Snake River between Idaho and Oregon.

It said final design plans for two of the dams were to be filed during the day before the Federal Power Commission in Washington.

Company President T. E. Roach said construction of the Oxbow and Brownlee Dams — costing \$7 million dollars and producing almost half a million kilowatts of power — would begin as soon as the FPC approves the designs.

John Day Dam Plans Told

WASHINGTON (AP) — A recommendation to eliminate roughly 75 per cent of the authorized storage capacity of John Day dam on the Columbia River will come before the Army Engineers' Board of Rivers and Harbors Sept. 20.

The project as authorized calls for storage of some two million acre feet from a normal pool elevation of 255 to 292 feet. As modified in a new recommendation from district and division engineers, the dam would have a normal operating pool level ranging from 242 to 265 feet.

This would leave approximately 500,000 acre feet of storage for flood control and power generation.

The John Day report is one of two involving the Pacific Northwest which will come before the board.

The other is a recommendation that the existing flood control project on the Skagit River in Northwest Washington be abandoned.

District and division engineers have reported that benefits to be derived from local flood protection works on the river are insufficient to justify construction by the government at this time.

Bar Meetings Open In S.F.

SAN FRANCISCO (UP) — The 28th annual convention of the State Bar of California opens today with discussions scheduled on a wide variety of subjects.

The convention was formally opened at the Sheraton-Palace Hotel by Dewitt A. Higgs, San Diego, president of the State Bar.

Some 3000 delegates are scheduled to attend the five-day session of the organization, which represents 19,000 practicing lawyers.

Speakers at the meeting include Lewis Douglas, former director of the Bureau of the Budget and ambassador to Great Britain; Raymond Everhard, Master of the Rolls, England, and Gov. Goodwin J. Knight.

The Resolutions Committee rejected proposals on a number of controversial subjects because they are matters of "public policy", but the delegates will consider 61 resolutions covering many subjects.

Meeting at the same time as the bar will be the annual conference of California Judges and the annual conferences of district attorneys and of hearing officers of the Division of Administrative Procedure.

Brewery Firms Face Charges

PORTLAND (AP) — Sicks Century Brewery, Seattle, and Lucky Lager Brewing Co., Vancouver, Wash., are among five alcoholic beverage distributors accused of violating State Liquor Commission regulations.

Both are accused of making rebates on kegs of beer sold to retailers.

Other distributors cited to appear before the commission this week and the violation of which they are accused:

Brownson Distributing Co., Portland, furnishing equipment to a retailer.

Valley Distributors, Salem, giving a cash rebate on wine sales.

New Italian Importing Co., Portland, rebating cash on beer sales.

Under Oregon law manufacturers and wholesalers of beer and wine are prohibited from having any financial interest in licensed retail beverage establishments or from providing "equipment, gratuities, rebates, services, money or property" to retailers.

They were Everett Colley, 27, and Frank Recob, both of Springfield.

Temperatures continued to drop over most of the eastern third of the nation today as the leading edge of a cool air mass moved into the middle and north Atlantic states.

The cool air also reached into the western fringes of the south Atlantic states.

Readings in the upper Mississippi Valley and northern Great Lakes region held in the 30s early today. Grantsburg, Wis., however, recorded a chilly 28.

A warming trend in the Northern Plains hiked temperatures an average of 20 degrees. A heat wave, meanwhile, continued to grip the Southwest, Yuma, Ariz., and El Centro, Calif., recorded yesterday's highest reading, 112.

Light rains moistened parts of New England today while scattered showers and thunderstorms pelted the Gulf Coast region.
