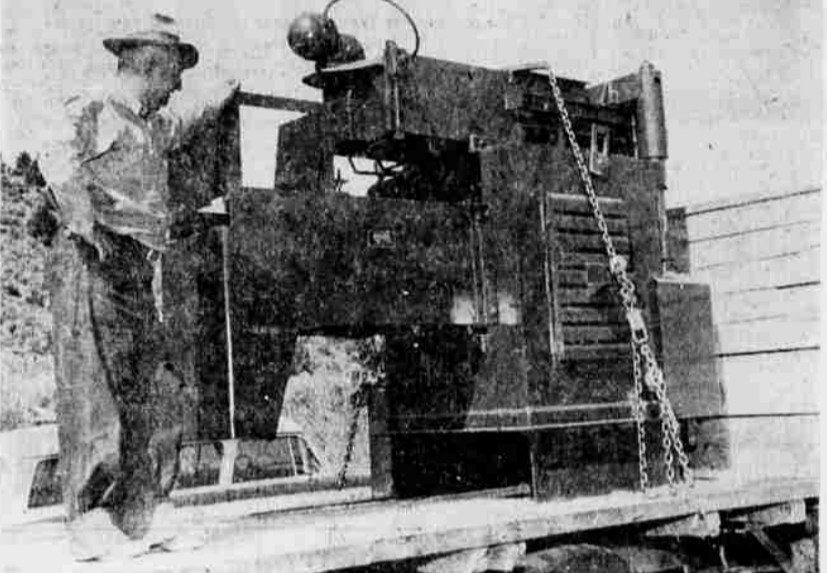

### Faure Confers With Ministers

PARIS (AP) — Premier Faure conferred Wednesday with key ministers on North African issues in an effort to recover Cabinet unity before proceeding to a Moroccan settlement.

A new Cabinet meeting was scheduled for later Wednesday or Thursday on the assumption that unity, broken Tuesday by Defense Minister Gen. Pierre Koenig of the Gaullist Social Republican party, can be restored.

The premier conferred with his "committee of five" which has been handling the Moroccan problem for the past month.

Koenig and Foreign Minister Pinay, both members of the committee, left it be known Tuesday they disagreed with terms of a formal letter to Mohammed Ben Moulay Arafat, sultan of Morocco, telling him in effect to quit his capital at Rabat by Friday and propounding him a general financial payment in return.

Koenig and Pinay, it was reported, wanted stronger assurances that the former sultan, pro-nationalist Mohammed Ben Youssef, will not be restored to the throne.

For this reason the letter which was sent to the resident general at Rabat has not yet been handed to the sultan.

### '55 Tourist Travel Rises In Oregon

SALEM — Results of the 1955 tourist survey, recently completed by the Highway Department's Traffic Engineering and Travel Information Divisions, indicates that there was a slight increase in the travel business for the past year. The survey shows that 1,031,125 foreign licensed cars, carrying an average of three people per car, spent over \$127,000,000 in Oregon during the year. This is an increase of 1 1/2 per cent over the 1954 travel business figure, when

visitors spent an estimated \$125,000,000. As in past years, California supplied Oregon with the largest number of visitors, followed by Washington, Grandview Idaho, Texas, and Illinois, in that order. Although the time spent in Oregon decreased from 6.8 days in 1954 to 6.2 days during the past year, the business total was kept high due to the fact that there was a five plus per cent increase in the total tourist traffic. Also, the daily expenditure per person increased from \$5.54 in 1954 to \$5.69 in 1955.

The number of miles driven by each car was 601 this year as compared to 644 last year. This coincides with the decrease in "days spent" factor and also to reports by other states. With very few exceptions, the surveys of other

states showed a tendency on the part of travelers to see as many major attractions as possible while on their trips. This shortened the length of stay and number of miles driven in one particular state or area. The survey further shows a slight increase in the number of campers and a slight increase in the number of people traveling in each car. This year's tourist survey was completed during the first three weeks of August at 17 points of departure from the state's tourist areas and took into consideration only those persons spending three or more days in the state.
