OHLMAYER RELEASED—BONN, Germany (AP)—The British Tuesday released Fritz Ohlmeyer, 65, from Werl Prison. His departure left 21 convicted German war criminals still in the prison. Ohlmeyer was originally condemned to death in 1946 for mistreating Allied nationals in the Wehrmacht concentration camp. His sentence was later reduced to 15 years' imprisonment.
