So. Cal. Oregon In PC Battle

Two pairs of Pacific Coast Conference football teams began pointing Tuesday toward games with each other this weekend, and the other squads looked to battles outside the conference.

Southern California will meet Oregon in a night game Friday at Los Angeles, and Oregon State will play Stanford at Portland Saturday night.

Coach Jess Hill put his Southern California Trojans through their last rough scrimmage. Quarterback Jim Contratto was calling the signals in place of Ellis Kinsinger. Ernie Zampese, alternating with Jon Arnett at tailback, connected with his passes, and Arnett and sophomore C. R. Roberts broke for long runs.

Coach Len Casanova had Oregon working on defense plans against Arnett. Casanova said defense against USC was difficult, with the Trojans varying from a single wing into a straight T or a split T. Hoping to avoid injuries, Casanova ran a short offense drill against dummies.

At Oregon State, sophomore Bob DeGrant of Burlingame, Calif., won a starting assignment at right end against Stanford. Tailback Joe Francis, who sprained his ankle Saturday in OSU's 23-0 victory over Brigham Young, was still out. Coach Tommy Prothro said it won't be known until Thursday or Friday whether Francis will play Saturday.

Stanford had injury problems too, but all of the news wasn't bad. Center Don Geddes, expected to be out with a knee injury all year, learned he might be able to play later in the season. End Steve Docter may play against Ohio State Oct. 1 and tackle Chris Plain may be ready for Michigan State Oct. 8. But tackle Bob Seymour and John Kidd and right halfback Gordy Young will be out of the Oregon State tussle.

EUGENE, Ore., (UP) — Coach Len Casanova pushed his University of Oregon Ducks through a secret session yesterday, designed to provide some way to prevent the hungry USC Trojans from serving them up on a platter.

Casanova praised his squad for its enthusiasm and hustle in beating Utah, 14 to 13, last week, but the Trojans are picked by many experts as the best on the Pacific Coast and they have a 58-12 win over Washington State to back them up.

CORVALLIS, Ore., (UP) — The Oregon State Beavers, sporting a 33-0 victory over Brigham Young, were warned yesterday by Coach Tommy Prothro that they better not expect to be unscored on this Saturday.

Prothro warned that his team won over a "comparatively weak ball club" and will be facing an entirely different situation when it tangles with the Stanford Indians. The Indians dumped College of Pacific, 33-14.

Hit Happy National Leaguers Establish One Mark, Eye Others

NEW YORK (UP) — The homer, combe gave up his 35th homer of the season, a record for a Brooklyn pitcher.

Mays, who tops the majors in homers this year, now has 50. Only six others — Babe Ruth, Jimmy Fox, Hank Greenberg, Mack Wilson, Ralph Kiner and Johnny Mize — ever have hit so many.

Robin Roberts, Philadelphia's 23-game winner, fell victim to the homer hammering last night at Brooklyn, giving up his 39th and 40th of the season—a record total of home runs off a pitcher. Teammate Murry Dickson held the old mark of 39, set in 1948 with St. Louis.

Willie Mays of New York poked into the picture, too, swatting two in a doubleheader with Pittsburgh for a record-equaling total of seven in six consecutive games. Two other Giants, George Kelly (1924) and Walker Cooper (1947) already shared the mark.

And Monday night, Ernie Banks, Chicago's slugging shortstop, set a record with his fifth grand-slam of the year. Ten players shared the old mark of four. Banks, with 44, set a major league record for shortstops when he walloped his 40th.

Frank Keller and George Shuba lagged Roberts for the tying and record-setting homers in the second game of a two-night sweep by the Brooklyn Dodgers. The two shots gave the National League champs 201 for the season. Only two clubs, the Giants (who set the team mark with 221 in 1947) and the Dodgers (with 208 in '53) ever have hit 200 or more in the majors.
