

Mounties Seek Six Lost Men

PRINCE ALBERT, Sask. (AP) — Canadian Mounties began a search Friday for six young men who left 65 days ago on a 600-mile canoe trip into Northern Canada's forbidding Barkin Lands.

A supply cache was found at Dubaynt Lake, little more than half way along the route the six

planned to follow from Stony Rapids in Northern Saskatchewan to Baker Lake in the Northwest Territories.

A message left with police at Stony Rapids outlined their route and said they had enough food for 80 days. There has been no sign of them at Baker Lake.

The leader of the expedition was identified as Arthur B. Moffat of Norwich, Vt., a lecturer-explorer. Three other members were believed to be Edward Lapointe, 21, of Sao Paulo, Brazil; Bruce LeFavour, 20, of Amsterdam, N.Y.; and Peter Franck, 18, of San Mateo, Calif. The other two were not identified.

The Barkin Lands are a vast, sparsely inhabited area of tundra, lake and stream and glacier-scattered rock. The group had planned to retrace a route taken in 1883 by Canadian government surveyor J. B. Tyrell.

Soviets Free 31 Prisoners

BERLIN (AP) — The Soviet Union Friday released 31 prisoners, including 12 Frenchmen and 15 Germans, the German Red Cross reported. Officials said the prisoners transport also included two Belgians, a Swiss and a Dutchwoman.

The only ones not immediately placed in Western hands were the 15 Germans and the Dutchwoman. The Red Cross said they remained at a transit camp at Frankfurt-on-Oder, East Germany.

According to the Moscow announcement, the Frenchmen had been serving terms for "crimes against the Soviet Union." All were reportedly civilians.

The Red Cross said the German contingent included civilians and former members of the Nazi Wehrmacht.

Morse Sees Ike's Defeat

PORTLAND (AP) — Sen. Morse (D-Ore) decried the "low political morality" of this administration Thursday and told Democrats they will defeat President Eisenhower if he runs for reelection.

"I'm for taking the fight to him. I want him to run. He is making a statesman out of Grant and an honest administration out of Warren Harding," Morse told the Democratic Business and Professional Men's Club.

Morse, who quit the Republican Party in 1952 to campaign against Eisenhower, said, "Democrats ought to stop hoping for someone else to run in his place."

He said Eisenhower would have to shoulder blame for the mistakes and "low political morality" of his administration. He added that the cabinet has demonstrated a "conflict of interest," and that not in 50 years has there been only than under this administration, more of a trend to business monop-
