

Red Relations Agreement Approved By W. Germans

BONN, Germany (AP)—The West German Bundestag unanimously approved the establishment of diplomatic relations with the Soviet Union today.

The vote was made by a show of hands.

The ratification of Chancellor Konrad Adenauer's Moscow agreement with Soviet Premier Bulganin ended a two-day debate during

which the 79-year-old government chief said the new trend in German-Russian relations "offers the prospect of future easing of international tensions and national unity in freedom to Germany."

Erich Olenhauser, leader of the Socialist opposition similarly told the lower house of Parliament normalization of relations between West Germany and Russia "can banish for a long time the danger of a hot war."

Before the vote, the floor leader of Adenauer's Christian Democratic Union, Heinrich Krone, said that Bonn could never recognize the Communist regime of East Germany. He added that if Bulganin believed the East Germans were behind him, he should allow free elections there.

Krone denied that the new relations with Moscow would deepen the division of Germany. If that was the case, no member of the Bundestag would be able to vote for the Moscow agreement, he declared.

Olenhauser had his criticisms of the Adenauer-Bulganin agreement. He said it was a victory for the Russians which appeared to be leading to a hardening of the divisions of Germany. He called on the government to make concrete proposals to the Geneva foreign ministers' conference next month on a European security system and German reunification.

The Socialist chief warned that unless Bonn took the initiative vigorously there was danger that the cold war would continue in Germany even if it ceased elsewhere, and (2) East and West might agree on a security system based on the continued split of Germany.

Storm Blocks Alberta Roads

CALGARY, Alta. (AP)—Drifting snow from a storm that claimed one life and forced postponement of a mammoth civil defense exercise clogged southern Alberta highways Thursday.

At least 100 persons were stranded overnight at the town of Strathmore, 30 miles east of here, when their cars bogged down in the drifts. Highway patrols took the motorists to town.

The 5 1/2-inch snowfall covered grain fields but agriculture officials said it was too early to say whether any serious crop damage would result.

Greece To Stay In NATO Pact

WASHINGTON (AP)—Well-posted observers discounted today speculation that Greece, in the bitterness of her disappointment over Cyprus, would break her ties with the North Atlantic Alliance.

But they said the West must brace itself for a period of strain with whatever government holds power in Greece for the next few months.

Greek frustration over Cyprus boiled over when a United Nations Steering Committee voted Wednesday against a General Assembly discussion of self-determination for the island now ruled by Britain.

Greeks believe the Greek-speaking majority on Cyprus would vote to join Greece. Turkey opposes any such union with Greece for the Mediterranean island, which has a Turkish minority.

The United States voted against the U.N. debate and thereby incurred some of the wrath Greek spokesmen and newspapers have been pouring on Britain and Turkey. Athens dispatches told of press demands for Greece to withdraw, not only from the Balkan Alliance with Turkey and Yugoslavia, but from the North Atlantic Treaty Organization itself.

Diplomats here, however, said there is every reason to believe responsible Greek leaders will realize that Greece would not, in the long run, gain from a neutralist course.

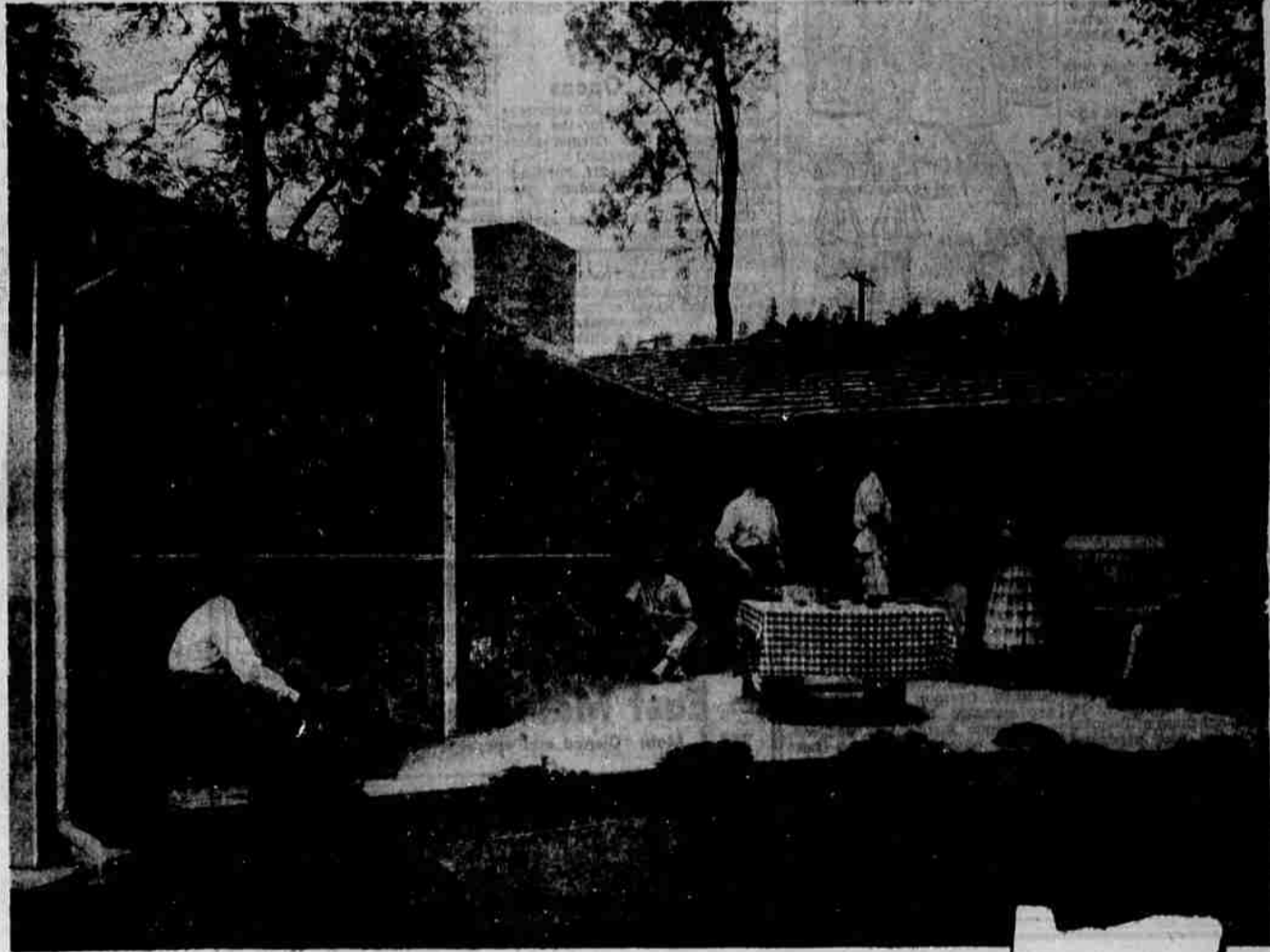
