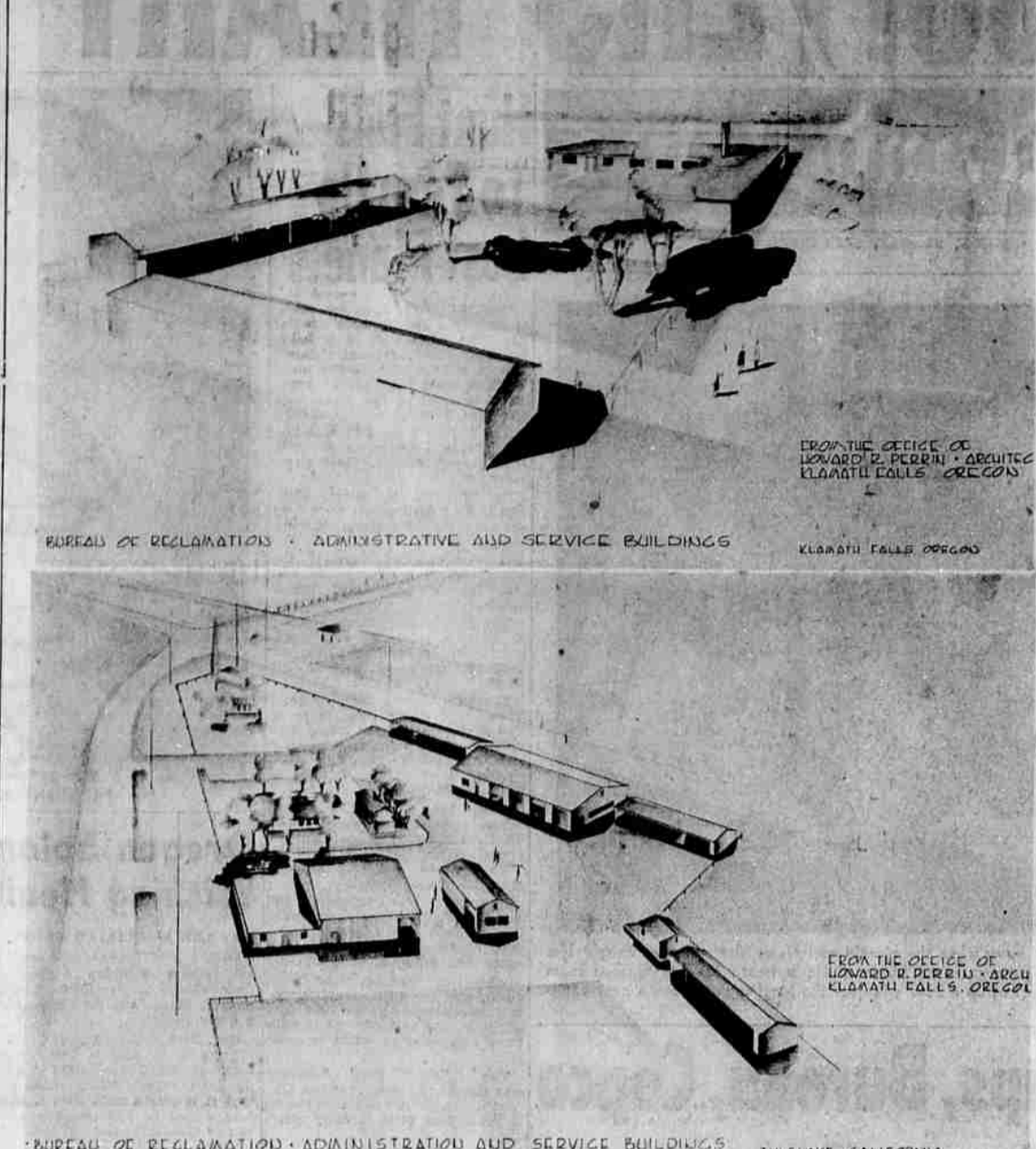

USBR Building Bids Asked

Sealed bids in duplicate will be received until 2 p.m., October 13, in the District Public Works Office, Room 100, Building 232, U.S. Naval Station, Seattle for resettlement of the Klamath and Tulelake project facilities of the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation according to information received today from the 13th Naval District.

Specification No. 44484 and other bidding data and information may be obtained on application to the District Public Works Officer in Seattle. Deposit of a check for \$30, payable to the treasurer of the United States, is required as security for the safe return of each set of bidding data.

Lt. D. M. Fenman, officer-in-charge of construction, said that a limited number of specifications and bid data may be obtained at his office in the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation at the airport.

The work includes the construction of three one-story headquarters buildings consisting of concrete foundations and floor slabs, steel roof trusses and wood roof deck with built-up roofing. Exterior walls will be concrete masonry units with interior of wood frame with wall board finish.

There will be 13 prefabricated metal buildings of various sizes with concrete foundations, concrete floor slabs or gravel floors and one pump house of concrete and masonry construction.

The work also includes heating, plumbing, ventilation and electrical systems and paving with asphaltic concrete and surfacing of roads and parking areas with crushed rock.

THE CAMERA CORNER

A noted pictorial photographer wrote in a recent magazine article, "Good pictures are taken with cameras, but they are made in the darkroom." And he added, "Any amateur photographer who fails to do his own darkroom work is missing half the fun of his hobby."

Some of you may take these words with a grain of salt, but not those who do their own darkroom work. If you've thought of doing it, but hesitated because of the costs involved, or because you don't have the space, toss those excuses out.

The kitchen sink or bathroom, used in the evening after it's dark, is all the darkroom space you need to start.
