The Retail Selling program serves the merchant and wholesaler by meeting the need for trained personnel and serves the manufacturer by point-of-sale service. It serves the student by supplementing his basic educational background by specialized, and on the job training in his chosen occupation, and provides a chance to earn while he learns; and it permits him to enter the full time labor market as a trained experienced worker.

It serves the consumer by improving the customer satisfaction through better selling and better service from more proficient employees.
