House Slates Navy Probe

ST. LOUIS (AP)—Rep. Hollifield (D-Calif.) says the House Military Operations Subcommittee, of which he is chairman, will make an inquiry of the Navy's handling of its jet fighter plane procurement program.

Hollifield made this announcement in a statement issued yesterday from his Washington office, the St. Louis Globe-Democrat said. Sen. Symington (D-Mo) and Rep. Karsten (D-Mo) had called for congressional investigations after a Globe-Democrat copyrighted story that the Navy had admitted it has 21 jet fighters costing \$28,350,000 which probably never will fly because of insufficient engine power.

Rep. Cannon (D-Mo), chairman of the House Appropriations Committee, sent a telegram to Secretary of the Navy Charles Thomas demanding an explanation. The first secretary of the Air Force, Symington said he believed the Navy and Westinghouse Electric Corp., manufacturer of the engines, shared responsibility for the failure of the engines to supply sufficient power.

McKay Lists O&C Payments

WASHINGTON (AP)—Eighteen Western Oregon counties will share some nine million dollars from the sale of timber from O&C lands, Secretary of the Interior McKay reported Monday. The payment for the fiscal period ending June 30 is nearly 2 1/2 million more than for the previous year.

Pogo Plane Plans Seen

WASHINGTON (AP)—Plans for an aircraft designed to take off or land vertically, yet fly almost 1 1/2 times the speed of sound, were to be shown to Defense Department officials Tuesday. A small-scale model of the proposed craft was prepared for the purpose. The craft, after vertical takeoff, would tuck its rotor blades back to form a sort of tail, somewhat like that of a shuttlecock, and would fly forward in level position like a jet airplane.

Coming in for a landing, the pilot would return power from the jet exhaust to the tail rotor, the blades would fan out again to provide a helicopter lift, and the craft would lower gently to the ground. E. Burke Wilford, wealthy Philadelphia backer of the design, said the craft is designed to reach speeds of up to 1,150 miles an hour as a jet plane, yet could land safely, with power off and rotor blades auto-rotating, at only 50 miles an hour.

Atlantic Cable Job Nears End

OBAN, Scotland (AP)—The mammoth job of laying the first transatlantic telephone cable system is half done. Completion is expected by the end of next year.

The final splice in the west-coast section of the three-inch armored cable was made Monday night aboard the British cableship Monarch, nearly 2,000 miles long, the cable from Newfoundland to Britain has 51 repeaters at intervals of 37 miles.

The second book, "Uranium: Where it is and How to Find It," by Paul Dean Proctor, Edmund P. Hyatt and Kenneth C. Bullock, is written in non-technical language and includes maps and diagrams.
