Six years ago, Eddie was introduced to a hotel night club audience here as a "young man who will be one of the country's most important singers."

Last night Sullivan County Judge Lawrence Cooke united him with the blonde, diminutive actress in a three-minute ceremony attended only by some 30 relatives and close friends. The ceremony, originally planned for Sunday, was postponed until last night because of Yom Kippur, Jewish day of atonement. Eddie is the Jewish faith. Debbie is a Protestant. "I know this ceremony was planned for yesterday. I admire you, Mr. Fisher, for keeping the precepts of your religion and you, Mrs. Fisher, for respecting your husband's beliefs."

Chilean States Undergo Siege

SANTIAGO, Chile (AP)—Fierce Chilean provinces today were under a state of siege—modified martial law. President Carlos Ibanez's government said it needed the added authority to deal more effectively with "subversive activities and movements constituting an overthrowing the existing regime."
