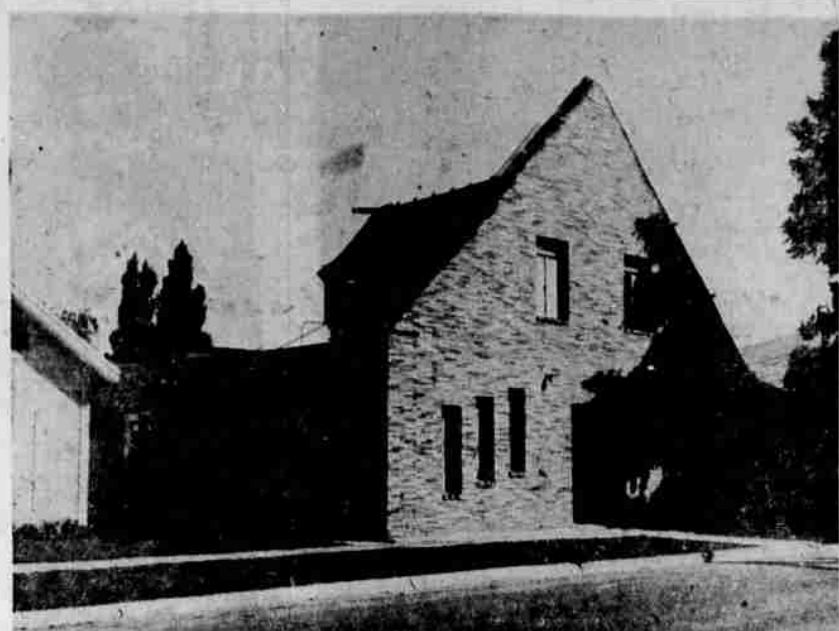

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Advisers See Grain Increase

YAKIMA (AP) — A 167 per cent increase in Pacific Northwest grain movements in the last quarter of 1955 was predicted Monday by the Pacific Northwest Advisory Board.

The board in its quarterly report on expected rail freight traffic in Washington, Oregon and North Idaho said the increase over the same period a year ago would be the result of a wheat export program by the Commodity Credit Corp.

The board forecast regional carloadings in October, November and December of nearly 29,000 compared to 10,824 in the same three months last year.

The report predicted increases for most Pacific Northwest products. However, decreases were forecast in fir log loadings, 8 per cent; sugar beets, 10 per cent, and dairy products, 4 per cent.

Major increases expected included: Apples, 21.4 per cent; other fresh fruits, 29.3 per cent; coal and coke, 24.5; iron and steel, 42; cement, 22.8; paper, paperboard, etc., 26; woodpulp, 14.3 and aluminum, 10 per cent.

The board predicted an overall increase in lumber and forest products of 3 per cent, mainly in the logs, 5.3 per cent, and plywood, pine belt. Pine region lumber is expected to increase 10 per cent.

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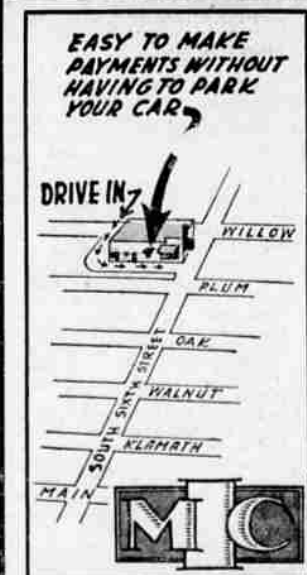


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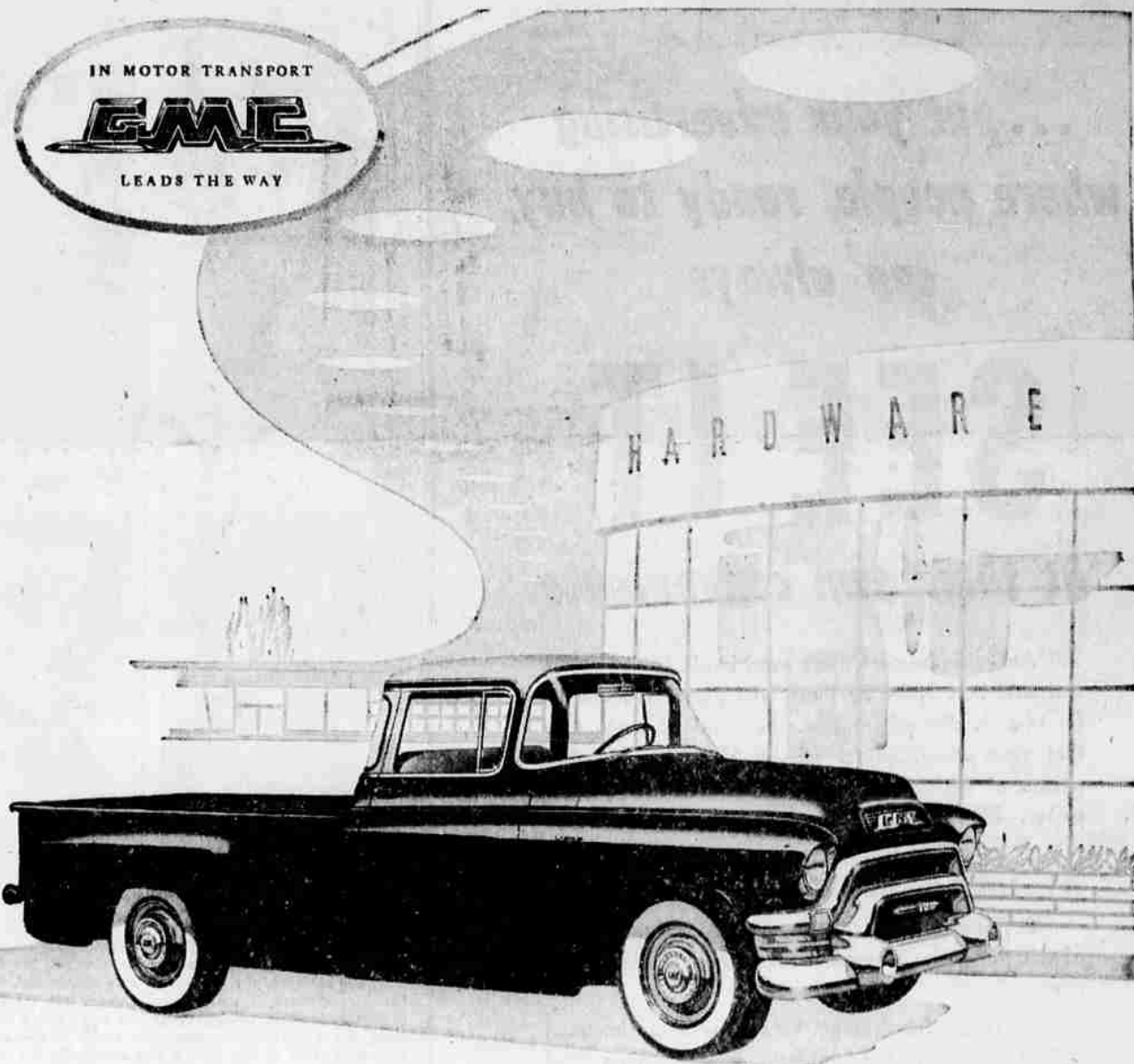


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
