Take it from me... Bessy's Dairy Dishes

By Bessy, the Basin Bessy. Creamed foods come easy. They are terrific for those quick fix-em-ups. And what a variety. Like toast triangles, or toasted English muffins, or chow mein noodles, or pastry shells. Even good old Klamath spuds, baked and cracked, or rice or crisp crackers. Or Spaghetti or noodle nests.

Have you noticed, though, that there's a real taste in your milk. It tastes really good, and that's why it is in such demand. Refreshingly good, you might say.

And you can notice its taste even in creamed foods. But as long as you use good fresh milk—from Klamath's own, local dairies—you'll not know the difference. Grade "A", of course, is always a MUST with milk.

For one fine creamed food — Chicken à la King—you'll need: One cup sliced fresh or canned mushrooms, 4 tablespoons butter, 4 tablespoons flour, 1/2 teaspoon of salt, 2 cups of milk, 2 cups of diced cooked chicken, a teaspoon of onion juice, 1/4 teaspoon of pepper, 1/4 cup of pimiento strips, and patty shells or toast points.

Fry the mushrooms in butter until slightly browned. Blend in flour, salt, and heat until bubbly. Add milk and cook, stirring constantly until sauce boils and thickens. Add chicken, onion juice and pepper. Heat thoroughly. Remove from heat, add pimiento and serve in patty shells or on buttered toast points. This should serve six.

And served with tall, refreshing glasses of milk, it's the best. You can take it from me. —Bessy.
