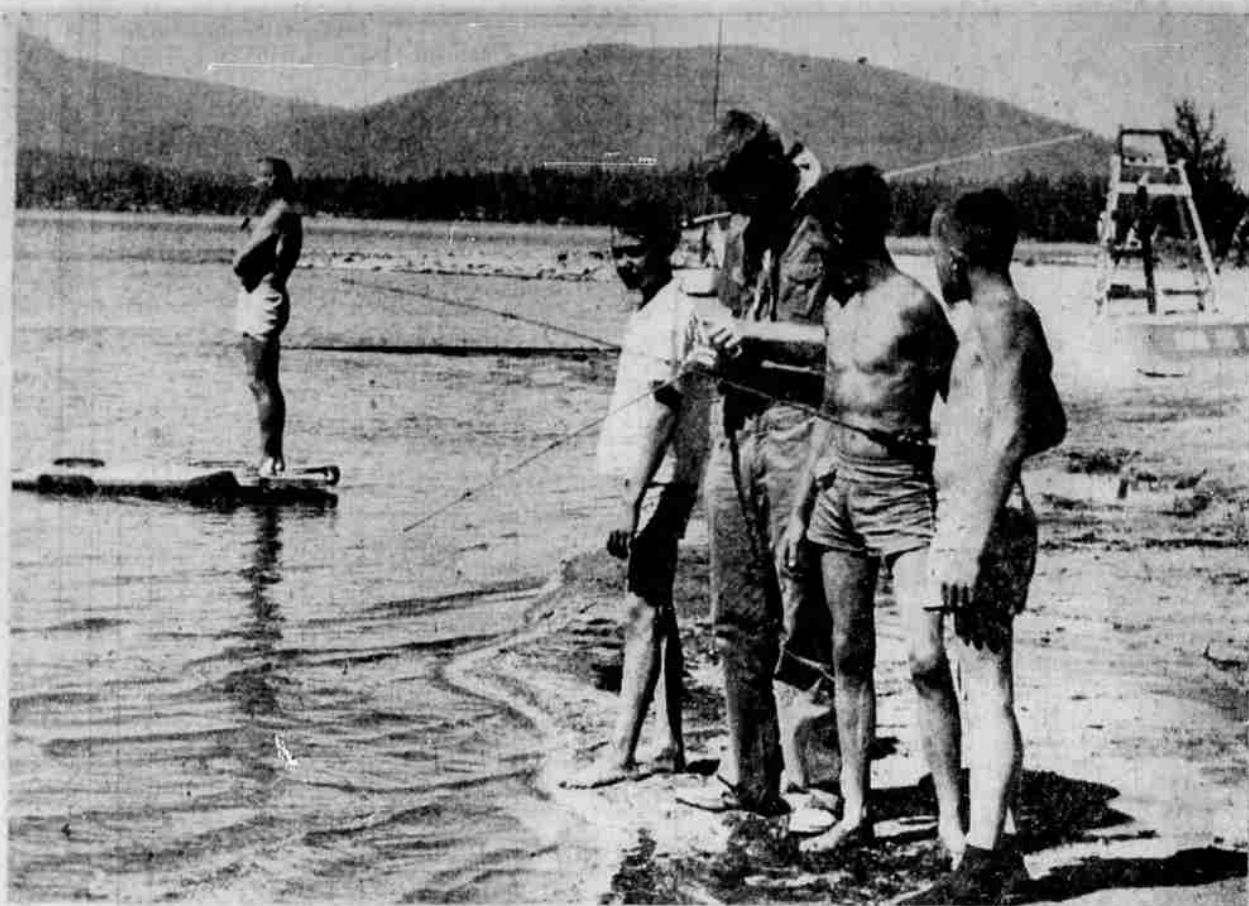


CAMP MAKUALLA
