



Butler Makes Victory Claim

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — Vice President Nixon "is the easiest Republican to beat" for the presidency but the Democrats will win next year from anybody, says Chairman Paul Butler of the Democratic National Committee.

Butler, here for a Jefferson-Jackson Day fund-raising dinner, discussed 1956 presidential possibilities at a press conference. His talk to the party rally was concerned mainly with a plea for Democratic unity and with an endorsement of Sen. Lister Hill for renomination and re-election next year.

Butler said Nixon would be his choice as "the Republican candidate for president easiest for the Democrats to beat."

Butler was here on a swing through the South. He made no direct reference at the dinner to the effort of E. D. Nixon, a Montgomery Negro, to buy a ticket for the meeting, but he did say he did not know why anyone would think he would not come to Birmingham.

Gov. G. Mennen Williams of Michigan decided not to come here for the dinner after Nixon failed to get a ticket. Birmingham's segregation laws prohibit Negroes and white persons from dining together in public places.

Butler predicted that the Solid South, broken in 1948 and 1952 elections, would return solidly to Democratic ranks as a part of a Democratic sweep next year.

Butler said the illness of President Eisenhower had brought more appeals for readmission into the Democratic party than at "any time in 100 years."

THE ONE THOUSANDTH student to register for the fall term at Oregon Technical Institute was Glen Marcum, NYTTA, Oregon, who is studying gunsmithing. Total enrollment announced by Winston Purvine, OI director, as of Monday, October 3, was 1,019, peak figure for any one term since the college was opened. Present enrollment indicates a probable 1,200 students before the end of the year. Largest class enrollment is in diesel technology with 200 students, followed by electronics technology with 120. There are 110 women students on the campus. October 4 was the last day for registering without a \$1 per day penalty. Over 90 per cent of the enrollment is from Oregon. Other students are registered from Maine to Hawaii and from Alaska to Florida.
