



Lakeview Model Home Opened

LAKEVIEW — More than 300 persons viewed a new model home on Fourth Street South Sunday during a public open house sponsored by the Lakeview Home Builders.

The complete home featured furniture by Lucas Furniture and appliances from Flym's.

This home is one of seven built in that locality by Lakeview Building Material Company which plans to construct six more homes in this development, according to Don Clause of the building material company.

Work will be started on them this fall, if weather permits. Clause said. The homes are in three models, each containing three bedrooms. They feature insulated walls, floors and ceilings, ceramic tile baths, fireplaces, hardwood floors, birch kitchen units and floor-to-ceiling wardrobe closets.

Writer Describes Increase Of Institution Expenses

SALEM (AP) — It's costing more than three times as much to take care of each inmate in Oregon's largest institutions than it did 10 years ago.

Nobody seems to mind, because the inmates get much better care and treatment.

It was only a decade ago that the Board of Control, mindful that the institutions were far behind the times, decided to start a vast program of new buildings and other improvements.

At that time, it cost only \$23.54 a month to take care of a patient at the Oregon State Hospital, and \$29 for each convict at the prison. The cost today is \$87 a month at the hospitals, and \$97 at the penitentiary.

The increase was caused partly by higher living costs. But most of it is the result of more extensive use of drugs, better foods, higher

salaries for employees, and improved treatment.

This long-range building program isn't near completion yet. Two of its most important projects—the new state hospital in the Portland area and the new reformatory—won't be started until next year.

But there has been enough building so that the institutions are greatly improved over their status at the close of World War II.

An important milestone will be reached next month when the new wing at the state hospital is opened. Costing \$1,500,000, it will house 677 patients.

It won't relieve the institution's overcrowding very much. But it will get a lot of patients into modern quarters.

The new wing is completed, and is awaiting acceptance from the contractor. Hospital doctors think it's the finest building of its kind anywhere.

At the same time, the hospital will get a modern kitchen at a cost of \$400,000. This will mean a big improvement in food service for the patients.

The new cell block at the prison is half finished. When it is opened next summer, the penitentiary can tear down the last of the old cell blocks that were built 80 years ago.

Gov. Paul Patterson doesn't like it when the police are criticized. As commander of the Oregon State Police, he rises quickly to the defense of the officers of the law.

The governor was talking the other day about his belief that the public has little respect for police and other law enforcement officers.

"The reason for that," he said, "is that we see comic strips, movies and stories about crooked

cops, and about cops would beat confessions out of people. Then we see stories about dumb cops, and about cops who take bribes.

"Children should be taught that police are protectors of the public, instead of public enemies.

"In all my experience, I never have seen a policeman like those depicted in the funny papers, in mystery stories and in some television plays."

The governor added that whenever a person reads about the wrong kind of cop, he immediately thinks all policemen are like that officer.

He told about his little granddaughter who was afraid to ride in the governor's state car because a state policeman was driving.

He coaxed her in. Her fears were allayed when the officer started talking about his own little daughter.

Wood River Cattle Moved

PORT KLAMATH — The annual fall shipment of whiteface Hereford cattle from the Wood River Valley pastures is in full swing, with cattle trucks rolling in and out of Port Klamath by day and night.

Most of the stock is consigned by truck directly to the destination, but some cattlemen still prefer to drive their cattle to Chiloquin for shipment by rail.

Top price for prime grass fed steers this fall is reported to be 18 cents per pound on the hoof and buyers appear to be indifferent to purchasing grass fed stock even at this price. As a result, several cattlemen are shipping stock to feed lots for grain feeding in order to command a higher price in the markets. Ranchers fortunate enough to have contracted for their stock last spring are reported to be receiving 20 cents a pound on the hoof, but the open market is slow.

Despite the unusually cold, dry season this year, stock has thrived on the grass pastures of the Wood River Valley, although ranch hands were kept busy irrigating the land because of the lack of rainfall.

Barros Increases Election Lead

RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil (AP) — Former Gov. Adhemar de Barros of Sao Paulo held a substantial lead today in the counting of ballots from last Monday's presidential election.

With about 28 per cent of the anticipated 10 million votes counted, De Barros, multimillionaire leader of the Social Progressive party, had a 71,134-vote margin over Juscelino Kubitschek, running with the support of two parties organized by the late President Getulio Vargas.

About half the votes in Sao Paulo where De Barros is strongest, had been counted, however. It was evident several days would be needed to show whether his lead would hold up.

De Barros also was running ahead in the Federal District and the states of Maranhao and Parana.

The vote: De Barros 943,301; Kubitschek 856,177; Maj. Gen. Juarez Tavora, representing old anti-Vargas forces, 836,280; and Plinio Salgado of the Popular Representation party, 280,864.
