Gondola Ski Lift Proposed

DUNSMUIR—A gondola-type enclosed tram carrying four passengers was suggested as the best type chair lift for the development of the Panther Meadows site on Mount Shasta by Hans Sarbach, sales manager of the Herron Engineering Company of Denver. Sarbach met with the steering committee of the Mount Shasta chair lift committee on Tuesday at a breakfast meeting at the Hotel Dunsmuir.

Sarbach explained the gondola-type cars would provide better protection against the wind and sun, especially for summer tourists not dressed for the 10,000 foot elevation at the top of the lift.

He was asked by the committee to discuss with his company all factors involved in preliminary engineering for construction of the lift and to submit an estimate on costs as soon as possible.

Plans were made at the meeting to raise \$5,000 locally for groundwork of the lift development. Nearly \$1,000 has been raised already, the committee reported.

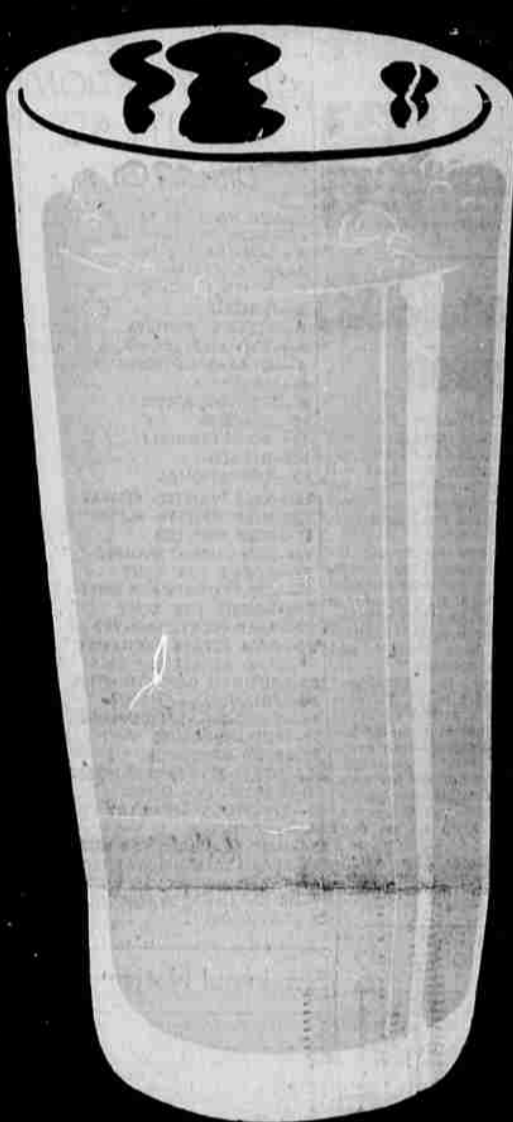

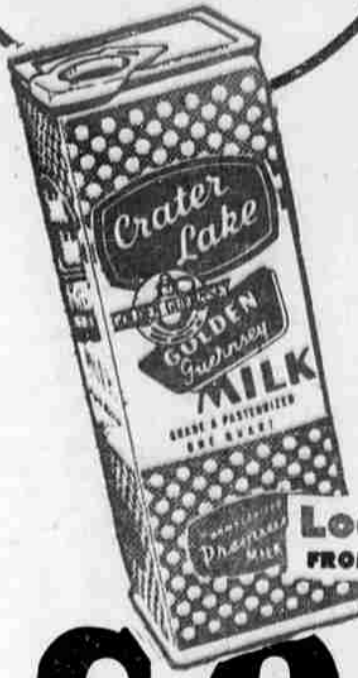

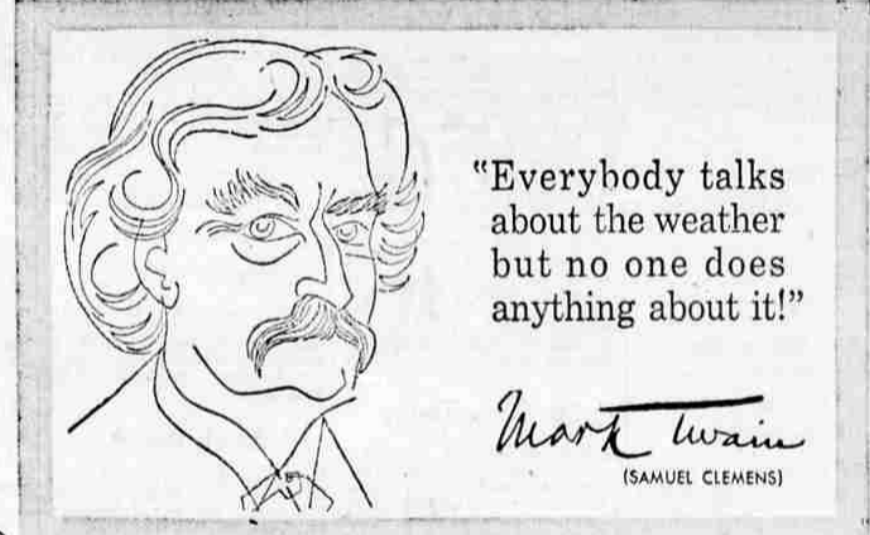
