Coed Pits Her Will Against Hypnotist For \$100,000

HOLLYWOOD (UP)—A shy college freshman will be offered \$100,000 on TV's biggest giveaway show tonight—but psychiatrists, her hypnotist and friends agreed she'll turn it down.

All 19-year-old Pat Morris has to do is pick up the money from a table on the "Truth or Consequences" show (NBC-TV 5 p.m. EDT). She won't have to answer any difficult questions about baseball or the Buckingham Palace menu.

But experts say she "doesn't have a chance" because hypnotist Arthur Ellen of Brooklyn will tell her to ignore the greenbacks.

Pat, preparing today for her USO classes as usual, wasn't optimistic about her chances for a fortune, either.

"I don't know whether I have a chance," she said. "My friends say I don't. But I'm not scared about going on the show."

"The idea is my will against the hypnotist's will. Maybe I can win."

Hypnotist Ellen said he was so confident he'll be putting up the \$100,000 himself. He picked Pat from the studio audience last week as a person "susceptible" to hypnosis. Ellen put her in a trance twice this week. The second time he said her fingers would feel stuck together when she awoke, and his suggestion came true.

On the show Ellen will hypnotize

Pat by saying the word, "Reena." He'll tell her not to pick up the money. Then he'll snap her out of the trance and millions of viewers will watch to see if she puts her fingers on the cash.

A prominent psychiatrist said Pat would not pick up the money because to her subconscious mind it isn't important.

"Money is important to the rational, or conscious mind, but not to the subconscious," the doctor explained. "Money is not a basic urge among people."

"If the hypnotist told her to hurt herself, or kill somebody, for example, she would refuse. But money will not stir up any conflicts because it basically isn't important."

He added that "No lasting harm to her mind could result" from Pat's taking part in the experiment.

Before the show, Pat rationalized that "I wouldn't know what to do with all that money, anyway." If she loses she gets a consolation prize of \$1,000. She plans to buy a trip to Hawaii or a new refrigerator for her Alpha Phi sorority, or put in the bank.

All week nine-year-old, brown-haired Pat has been guarded by a network representative so she couldn't be "influenced." Her father is vice president of an aircraft company and the family lives in fashionable Brentwood.

Pat has become a campus celebrity. The boy who sits behind her

in French class proposed. Letters poured in from all over the country, including one from a Florida man who wants \$25,000 to tell her how to beat the game. Other fans wanted pin-up pictures.

She also was invited to a party given by Joan Crawford.

"I looked at her big eyes and thought she would make a good subject for a hypnotist, too," smiled Pat.
