**Social Party Takes Lead**

**RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil (UPI)**— Juscelino Kubitschek, Communist-supported candidate of the Social Democratic Party, took a commanding lead today in Brazil's presidential elections. His victory appeared assured.

Jose Goulart, Kubitschek's running mate, also moved out in front in the separate race for the vice presidency. He, too, appeared a certain winner.

Returns, as reported by the semi-official Radio Nacional, gave Kubitschek an even more increasing lead over his closest competitor, Adhemar de Barros, millionaire industrialist candidate of the Social Progressive Party.

Victory for Kubitschek was predicted when counting of the estimated 19,000,000 ballots came Monday neared the halfway mark with the majority of his strongholds still to report. The 54-year-old former governor of Minas Gerais lagged behind in the early returns but surged ahead with the increasing returns from his home state.

Kubitschek ran with the support of the Labor Party and the Communists, whose party is outlawed in Brazil but continues to operate openly. He is considered the political heir of the late President Getulio Vargas who committed suicide last year after his ouster by the military.

Goulart, his running mate, is a protege of Vargas and a leader of the Vargas Labor Party. The armed forces once forced his ouster from the Vargas cabinet as a prelude to the movement against the late president himself.

President Joao Cafe Jr., who succeeded Vargas, did not run for re-election. He threw his support behind the army-supported 45-year

old Tavora who ran as the candidate of a three-party coalition headed by the National Democratic Union.

Salgado, 60-year old former leader of the Brazilian Fascist movement, was the candidate of the rightwing Party of Popular Representation.

**October Rains Hit Midwest**

The early October wet spell continued over broad areas of the eastern half of the country today but clearing appeared in sight for most areas.

The rain belt extended over the Missouri, Mississippi and Ohio valleys, the Great Lakes region and most of New England.

Heaviest falls during the night were along the lower Mississippi River, with more than an inch recorded at several cities, and in Indiana, with 2.36 inches at Fort Wayne and 1.18 at Indianapolis. Amounts in 24 hours measured 3.50 inches at Syracuse, N.Y., and 2.51 inches at Buffalo.

Some 1 1/2 inches of rain fell in outlying sections of Detroit yesterday in 45 minutes, causing flash floods. Detroit Street Railways officials said the floods caused the city's worst traffic tieup.
