## Ike Due To Quit Hospital In Month; Long Rest Required

DENVER (UP) — President Eisenhower will leave Fitzsimons Army Hospital in Denver in the second week of November and fly to his farm at Gettysburg, Pa., for convalescence extending until about the start of 1956, it was learned today.

The recovery outlook for the President, who suffered a heart attack on Sept. 24, is about as favorable as it can be, without his physicians going overboard on temporary conclusions.

The people around him at Fitzsimons resigned themselves some days ago to the probability that he would bow out of the national political scene as a competitor in the early future.

Mrs. Eisenhower is in the forefront of influential persons who think that her husband, after more than 40 years of federal service,

is entitled to an uncomplicated recovery from his heart attack.

A carefully studied chart on the President's future was made public Sunday by Dr. Paul Dudley White, the eminent Boston heart specialist, and the staff of doctors who have been at the President's bedside for two weeks.

**Specialists Outlined Condition**  
In everyday terms, the Boston specialist, flanked by top heart men of the armed services, said:

1. The President has reacted from his Sept. 24 coronary thrombosis on schedule. Prospects for his future are favorable, but it is incorrect to say that he is out of danger "100 per cent."

2. He must follow a gradual schedule of recovery. His heart may never be as strong as it was before the thrombosis.

3. Medical authority refuses to say whether the President would be physically up to a re-election race next fall.

4. Mr. Eisenhower must remain in Fitzsimons for another four or five weeks.

5. The President can step up his rate of official conferences this week, beginning with Secretary of State John Foster Dulles Tuesday.

Dr. White expects to return to Denver for another look at the President in two weeks. Conditions warranting, he also plans to return in four weeks.

**Schedule Of Callers**  
It was the smiling vice president who disclosed ahead of the doctors that the President had requested establishment of a schedule of callers from the cabinet and other high government posts.

Nixon, and Maj. John S. Eisenhower, the President's son, flew back to Washington late Sunday in the plane with White.

Dr. White, with the assent of Maj. Gen. Howard McC. Snyder, the White House physician, outlined a gradual program for the President in his coming weeks of recovery in Denver.

Dr. White went on the theory that if any serious complications were in prospect, they would have developed in the first two weeks after the thrombosis. Knowing that no such complications had occurred, White then outlined a program for the immediate future.

**Few Short Conferences**  
Third week, beginning today: Continued rest, but bed wheeled out on hospital porches for air, sunshine and scenery. A few more short conferences.

Fourth week: Sitting up some of each day and possibly all day by the end of the week. May begin a little painting in bed. More short conferences, possibly daily.

Fifth week: A few steps, such as to the bathroom, with more steps each day and possibly more painting and sitting on the porches.

Sixth week: Walking slowly out to the porches. "At the end of the sixth week he may be able to walk onto the plane" for the return trip.

But this, Dr. White said, depends on progress to that point and "even another seventh week might be helpful before he moves East."

He said his general program for the period after that includes rehabilitation, recreation and more rest before the President actually resumes his full duties in the White House. He thought that might be possible around the first of the year.

## Austrian Cardinal Dies

VIENNA, Austria (AP) — Theodor Cardinal Innitzer, 79-year-old head of the Roman Catholic Church in Austria, died yesterday of a heart attack.

A target of Nazi mobs and Communist propaganda alike during the changing times of his cardinalate, he had undergone surgery in a Vienna hospital recently and was showing signs of recovery when the heart condition developed.

His death raised to eight the number of vacancies in the 70-member College of Cardinals.

Archbishop-Coadjutor Dr. Franz Jachym, who had been carrying on many duties of the office during the cardinal's illness, was named cardinal vicar to carry on administration pending appointment of a new archbishop. Religious circles considered Dr. Jachym a likely choice for the permanent post.

Cardinal Innitzer was the son of a poor Sudeten-German lace maker. He studied theology at Vienna Seminary and became its rector. He was named archbishop in 1932 and cardinal the following year.

## Clair Engle To Back Stevenson

RED BLUFF (UP)—Rep. Clair Engle (D-Calif.) backed Adlai Stevenson for president today and declared the former Illinois governor would be an "outstanding president."

"Adlai Stevenson should be the Democratic standard bearer in 1956," Engle said. "In my opinion he would be an outstanding President of the United States and is the finest candidate the Democratic Party could offer to the people."
